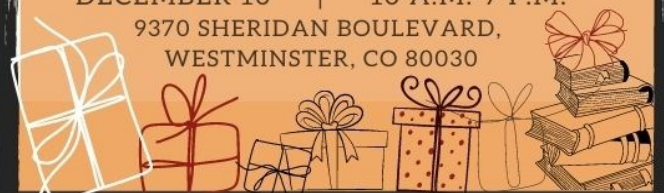

Toy Trains at the Veterans Museum

In partnership with the Colorado Toy Train Foundation (CTTF), the Veterans Museum Broomfield will be bringing trains of the mid-1900s to life.



From December 8-17, the Museum will house CTTF's modular 3-rail O-scale (1/4"=1', or 1/48th scale) train layout that features double loops of mainline and some triple tracked lines displaying military and holiday-themed trains. The CTTF will operate a frequently changing, kaleidoscopic panoply of trains featuring steam power locomotives that literally built the United States as we now know it, spanning westward from the original 13 British colonies on the Atlantic Coast to the shores of the Pacific Ocean. There will be trains pulled by first generation diesel-electrics to the current crop of super performance diesels boasting many tens of thousands of horsepower to keep our nation's economy supplied with basic raw materials and supplies of manufactured products from all over the US and other countries worldwide.

Kids of all ages from two years of age up to 102 will get the chance to operate the trains and animated industrial accessories, such as log loaders, lumber mills, coal handling, commodities loading and unloading, and scrap metal transference. This is a "can't miss." Visit the Museum on Tuesdays and Thursdays from 10 a.m.-2 p.m. and Saturdays from 9 a.m.-3 p.m. to see the trains in action. Bring family and especially children for this hands-on experience.



The Colorado Toy Train Foundation (CTTF) is headquartered in Lakewood. A 501(c)3 Foundation, they are devoted to promoting hobbies associated with operating and collecting toy and scale model trains.

News from the Broomfield Spellbinders

With the 2022-23 school year well under way, Broomfield Spellbinders are once again sharing stories with students in classrooms throughout the area. Sixteen of our volunteers visit 18 schools (in five school districts) and four senior facilities each month, sharing stories with almost 1,600 students from Pre-K through 5th grades (plus one 8th grade class) and an average of 35 seniors. Most of these visits are in person—face-to-face and heart-to-heart—and a few are presented virtually.

New Storytellers on the Way

We continue to look for additional storytelling opportunities and have added new volunteers to our team. On September 29, our most recent classroom training session ended. The six volunteers are (L-R) Tiffany Painter, Carla Randall, Trainer Wynn Montgomery, Jim Mariner, Alycia Murray, Betsy Crosby, Sherry Potter. When they complete the final required step—"shadowing" an experienced volunteer, all will become certified Spellbinders volunteer storytellers. The first three pictured definitely will join Broomfield Spellbinders; the others may join the Boulder Valley Spellbinders, which serves schools closer to their homes. All are welcome to affiliate with more than one local group.

We also exhibited member art September - November at the Broomfield Community Center and Broomfield Library and displayed individual artists' work at iPie Pizza and the Broomfield City and County Building. Toward the end of the year, we plan to hold an art supply and book swap and our annual holiday party with lunch, art exchange and a fun art activity. We will resume regular monthly meetings in January and will plan new art exhibits in the Broomfield community in the Spring.

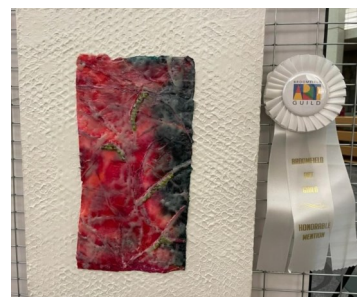
