#### **PARISH NURSE NEWS**

#### Do you Hygge?

Christmas-the most wonderful time of the year...well, mostly. But the frenzy of holiday to-do lists can take the joy out of the holiday season. Maybe it's time to practice hygge!

Hygge has been an important part of the Danish lifestyle since the early 1800's, and plays into the fact that Denmark is considered one of the happiest nations in the world.

According to the website hyggehouse.com, hygge (pronounced hue-guh) is a Danish word that cannot be translated to one single word but encompasses a feeling of cozy contentment and well-being through enjoying the simple things in life. Other English words that can be used to try to describe the idea of hygge include coziness, charm, happiness, contentedness, security, familiarity, comfort, reassurance, kinship, and simplicity. Helen Russell, who authored *The Year of Living Danishly*, describes hygge as "complete absence of anything annoying or emotionally overwhelming," with "a focus on togetherness and prioritizing the people in your life."

There is no "how-to" for hygge. It is not a tangible thing that you buy or create. "Hygge literally only requires consciousness, a certain slowness, and the ability to not just be present – but recognize and enjoy the present." according to author Lyndsey Matthews.

Some examples of hygge include a cup of tea and a good book, small intimate gatherings with friends, cuddling, fresh sheets on the bed, candle glow, honking geese and line-dried laundry, lingering at the dinner table for conversation and relaxation, enjoy what you have instead of striving for what you don't have, avoid falling into the perfection trap (people come to see you, not how well you keep house), and when folks come to your house, invite them to help you in the kitchen-this fosters caring and sharing, practice self-care without feeling guilty...

What can you think of that makes you feel cozy, content, and comforted? Need a little extra help to incorporating Hygge in your life? Journey to Bethlehem, a healthy habits program has components that encourage contentedness daily. Journey to Bethlehem began November 12<sup>th</sup>, and ends with final reports in by December 17<sup>th</sup>. As of Sunday, November 26, we have acquired about 1/3 of the mileage needed to complete the Journey to Bethlehem. New participants are always welcome (and needed!) at any time during the Journey to Bethlehem.



Christian Ed and Outreach & Mission are both collecting fleece for Mission Projects! Our children give fleece scarves to area schoolchildren. They need from <u>6 inches</u> to <u>1 yard</u> of plain and kid-friendly fleece for the scarves.

On February 18th Outreach and Mission invite you to our first Lenten Mission Project & Meal as we tie fleece blankets for Project Linus to help children in area hospitals and other transitions. They need 1.5 yard of plain and kidfriendly fleece for the blankets. Blankets are two sided, so you may want to provide two 1.5 yard pieces --one can be plain and one patterned.

We also really appreciate the many cash donations that are quietly handed to us on Sunday mornings and the food we find in the cart. We couldn't do it without you!!

(A little personal confession I have to make is that I was starting to fret because funds were getting low and we're going into the winter season and seeing homeless as well as our regular clients. But "magically", while I was trying to figure out what to do, donations of both food and money started to show up from several different sources.
