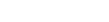

## First Day of School Reminders

**UNIFORM DRESS CODE** is in effect the first day of school and will be enforced. (Optional summer uniform may be worn through Friday, November 2nd.)

All clothing is to be the **PROPER SIZE**. The baggy look is not acceptable. Pants are to be worn at the waist, not the hips.

**Label ALL your child's clothing** (sweatshirts, sweaters, etc.).

**Label ALL your child's items** (books, lunchbox, book bag, etc.)

HAIRSTYLES AND HAIRCUTS—NO FAD HAIRSTYLES AND all hair MUST BE THE CHILD'S NATURAL COLOR. NO BLEACHED, DYED, OR STREAKED HAIR IS ALLOWED.

<u>BOYS</u> - haircuts are to be NEAT and trimmed properly. Hair is NOT to go beyond their shirt collar and/or beyond their eyebrow.

<u>GIRLS</u> - NO hair extensions are to be worn. Hair accessories are to be kept simple and are NOT be become a distraction.

LUNCH SERVICE - will be available.

**TRANSPORTATION** - Make sure your child knows what mode of transportation they will be taking. If they will be riding a bus, please make sure they know what bus they will be riding.



### **Emergency Information**

Emergency sheets for the family are included in the summer packet. This form provides the school with pertinent family information such as phone numbers (work and home), addresses, cell phone numbers, and emergency contacts. Please fill out the required information and return by **Monday, August 27, 2018, the first day of school.** 

Forms regarding each child's medical background will be sent home on the first day of school. Please complete one form for each child and return to school by **Tuesday**, **August 28, 2018.** 

## Protecting God's Children Program

Since the summer of 2004, the Diocese of Allentown has implemented a safe environment program in which parents, educators, employees, and volunteers work together to maintain the safest environment for children.

With this in mind, all volunteers who come into contact with children (e.g., serving as a classroom or lunchroom volunteers, assisting with a classroom party, serving as a chaperone for a field trip, working as a clerical assistant for a teacher or in the office, Scout leaders, CYO coaches, etc.) are required to attend a workshop called Protecting God's Children. This workshop emphasizes the harms of child sexual abuse and what can be done to prevent it.

Holy Guardian Angels will host this program on Saturday, August 25, 2018 - 9:00 AM - Noon.


You donate the hamburgers or hot dogs and our "grill masters" will cook them up!

## Taking Care of Your Books

All books are to be covered and carried in a school bag or tote bag. **Textbooks are to be** covered at all times with a book sock, book cover, or brown paper.

All workbooks must be covered with clear contact paper. Contact paper may be purchased through the School Store, or local shopping centers. Workbooks covered with contact paper are easy to identify and stay in good shape for the whole year.

Please cover only workbooks with clear contact (books children write in). Before covering with contact paper, please write your child's name and grade on the cover of the book. Workbooks should be covered no later than **Monday**, **September 17, 2018**.


