#### **SEPTEMBER NEWSLETTER 2021**

#### Friends,

I pray you are well! I write these words on Monday morning, looking back on a chaotic week for our church, community, state, and nation. Covid continues to disrupt the life of our congregation, many people in our parish are sick and overflowing our hospitals, we are getting first glimpses of damage along our coast in the wake of Hurricane Ida, and we are watching a humanitarian disaster unfold in Afghanistan. If your heart is heavy, or if you are experiencing anger more frequently, I can relate and I hope that you have a few close friends you can call on and who can call on you. We will often take pride in our independence and individuality, yet when we put too high a value on these things, we can neglect human need for community and weaken our collective ability to recover from sustained times of stress and loss.

Being part of a church, by both contributing and receiving, is to participate in such a community. I see in our church a group of folks fully committed to one another. Though there are differences and disagreements to be found in any such group, I see time and again that when push comes to shove, our people are there for one another. I am thinking of a few times just last week when I have seen our people pull together to demonstrate love and support for others. If you have contributed to the life of our church in the past couple of weeks, thank you. If you are reading these words and sense the absence of such a community in your life, I can say firsthand that I have found this church to be warm and inviting. I trust that you will too.

Like so many things these days, what it means to be in community seems to be changing. Time will tell if these changes are for better or for worse. But this word, *community*, is now used to simply mean a collection of people with a common interest. On Facebook, for example, you can be part of astronomy, recipe, or weather-watching groups. As a matter of fact, if you have interest in "things discovered in walls," and you want a community of others with such an interest, then this is your time! Because as our age discovers new ways of connecting people, it becomes easier than ever to surround ourselves with like-minded individuals. But if one common interest is all that is needed to be in such a relationship, then what happens when people eventually find themselves on opposite sides of another issue? This is where I think a vital part of what it means to be in community is being lost in our changing world. I believe community means that we are committed to the wellbeing of others in our group, even if they don't share in our other interests. Likewise, we can trust in them to have interest in our wellbeing, even if we think their enthusiasm for things found in walls is goofy. In short, genuine community comes with sacrifice of preference.

While community is essential to the life of a church, we are yet something more. One of my heroes of the faith, Eugene Peterson, both haunts and inspires me with his definition of local church. He says, "It had taken me a long time, with considerable help from wise Christians, both dead and alive, to come to this understanding of church: a colony of heaven in the country of death, a strategy of the Holy Spirit for giving witness to the already-inaugurated kingdom of God." Though the recent-seminarian in me gets almost giddy at the thought of unpacking all of this, I'll spare you (for now). I do want to drill down a bit on two points.

First, we are a colony. Imagine what the first colony on Mars will be like, so far from home. Imagine how much one would sacrifice, so that the group as a whole can thrive. Imagine how in turn the others must unite to sustain the one. Thankfully, we do not live in the desolation and death of Mars, yet there is much here on Earth that threatens, as this last week proves. We need one another if we are to remain as light in the darkness (Ephesians 5:8) and if we are to thrive. Secondly, we bear witness to the already-inaugurated kingdom of God! We are hearing in the Epistle of James this month how faith cannot simply live in the mind, how faith comes to live in the world through our actions. In infinite wisdom, God has ordained the actions of Christian community as the means by which the world can know the love of its Creator and Redeemer. Likewise, it is through our loving support of one another that we might know God is with us, in the trials of this week and in all of the weeks to come.


