DESCRIPTION: The Californian target bow was near the top of the line of USAC bows, just behind the Hawaiian. I have owned several USAC bows including a couple of Hawaiian models, and this Californian model is the best shooting USAC bow I've ever owned. Very smooth bow to shoot, and no limb shock. It does have more of a high wrist grip which was popular in the late 60's. Factory installed stabilizer insert. Bow has no delamination; no cracks; limbs are straight. Four layer tip overlays. Overlays and tips are in great condition. The only issue with this bow is cosmetic. There were a number of drilled holes which have been filled. You can see them up close (see pics), but not from a few feet away. No chips, dings or cracks. No crazing or stress cracks. A few minor scratches and nicks here and there. Decal is in good condition.

Comes with the pictured Hoyt Flex Rest and a new string.
