
New Title Holder Brags!

BREEDING PRACTICES

Our dogs have a total of 78 chromosomes, with 20,000 genes, resulting in millions of combinations of genes, when bred. Of those chromosomes, 76 are autosomes and 2 are sex chromosomes. All of the genes pass on the genetic information from parent to pup. These genes can be dominant or recessive. Most harmful traits tend to be recessive. For the trait to show up in offspring, that puppy must get a recessive copy of that gene from the sire and a recessive copy from the dam. In the case of a dominant trait, the pup can get a dominant gene from the sire and from the dam, or a dominant gene from just one parent.

When breeding, it is good to know what type of breeding you are doing, based on pedigree.

Outcross: This is a way for a breeder to introduce new traits into a breeding program. There are no common ancestors in 5-6 generations.

Linebreeding: Here, you can concentrate desirable characteristics. There are one or more common ancestors in the last 5-6 generations. You must look at health, temperament, type, and fertility to determine of you want to continue with a linebreeding. **Inbreeding:** This breeding sets type. You can get the best of the pedigree or the worst of the pedigree, or a combination of those. Specifically, inbreeding is a father x daughter, mother x son, or a brother x sister breeding.

In breeding you must be aware of the positive and negative, genetic issues. As always, as a breeder, you are responsible for the puppies you bring into this world. Puppies that have more negatives than positives must be culled from a breeding program, by being placed into pet homes.

Back breeding: When you do an *inbreeding* and you have an excellent example of the breed produced, with great temperament, health, and type, you take that offspring and breed it back to one of the parents. You can keep this up, until you have set type. This is what a back breeding would look like: $A \times B = C$ $A \times C = D$ $A \times D = E$ or $A \times B = H$ $A \times B = J$ $A \times B = K$

Many "great" dogs of the past have been produced using back breeding. They were also dogs that could set breed type in their offspring.

How do you make the decision to breed using outcrosses or related dogs? Take stock of the dogs you are interested in breeding. Look at the parts of the dogs and rate each part (red, green, yellow) and see if there is compatibility between the dogs. You probably do not want to breed red traits to red or red to yellow, but it will help you determine if your breeding choices will work with your program.

Recipes for You and Your Pets

For you...

Spanish Rice

Ingredients:

1 lb. Ground Beef (may substitute ground turkey or chicken if desired)

4 – 14 ½ oz. cans diced tomatoes with green chiles

 $2-14 \frac{1}{2}$ oz. cans water

2 – 6 oz. cans tomato paste

1 can black beans drained

1 can pinto beans drained

1 cup chopped onions

1 cup chopped bell pepper

1 medium jalapeno pepper cleaned and finely chopped

2 ½ cups white rice

Brown meat and drained fat.

In a large pot, combine all ingredients including the browned meat. Bring to boil. Lower heat, cover and simmer for 30-45 minutes or until the rice is cooked. Stir occcasionally after first 15 minutes of cooking time.

Great addition to Taco Night, for large families and potluck meals.

For Your Dog's...

Meatballs

Ingredients:

2 lbs. raw hamburger (the cheaper and fattier the better)

3 eggs

1 cup wheat germ


½ cup vegetable oil

2 cups quick cooking oatmeal

3/4 cup molasses

Mix all ingredients together in a big bowl. Make into meatballs (whatever size you prefer). Please the meatballs on a cookie sheet and freeze. Transfer frozen meatballs ina plastic freeze bag or container and store in the freezer. Thaw individual meatballs as needed. Keep a bag in the freezer for picky eaters or for whelping mothers, weaning puppies and dogs that have lost their appetite for any reason.
