John 1:6-8, 19-28



"A man named John was sent from God. He came for testimony, to testify to the light, so that all might believe through him. He was not the light, but came to testify to the light. And this is the testimony of John. When the Jews from Jerusalem sent priests and Levites to him to ask him, "Who are you?" He admitted and did not deny it, but admitted, "I am not the Christ." So they asked him, "What are you then? Are you Elijah?" And he said, "I am not." "Are you the Prophet?" He answered, "No." So they said to him, "Who are you, so we can give an answer to those who sent us? What do you have to say for yourself?" He said: "I am the voice of one crying out in the desert, 'make straight the way of the Lord," as Isaiah the prophet said." Some Pharisees were also sent. They asked him, "Why then do you baptize if you are not the Christ or Elijah or the Prophet?" John answered them, "I baptize with water; but there is one among you whom you do not recognize, the one who is coming after me, whose sandal strap I am not worthy to untie "This happened in Bethany across the Jordan, where John was baptizing."

Pastor's Study Desk Notes



Dear St Anthony & St Pius Families,

3rd Sunday Advent Year B

John 1:6-8, 19-28

"Who are you?" Word had spread about John the Baptist, so the religious authorities in Jerusalem sent some spies to go find out more about him. John 1:19 tells us, "The Jews from Jerusalem sent priests and Levites to ask him, "Who are you?" Maybe they had questions about John's teaching, or about his practice of baptism, or his lifestyle witness, or the fact that John had such an overwhelmingly popular response from people who were going out to him in droves. John 3:23 says that many "people came to be baptized". (his great popularity is reflected in comments from Mathhew 14: 5 & 21:26 "for they regarded him as a prophet.") Also, we even hear in John 1:35, the fact that John had disciples. One of John's disciples turns out to be Andrew, who actually catches his brother Simon Peter, for Jesus (John 1:41-42). John realized what the spies from Jerusalem was up to in their attempts to co-opt or put to tan end his ministry of repentance and reform preparing for the Mesiah, when he harshly calls them out in front of the crowds. Matthew 3:7, tells us that "When John saw many of the Pharisees and Sadducees coming to his baptism, he said to them, "You broad of vipers! Who warned you to flee from the coming wrath?" He knows that they are not sincere about conversion for Christ. They are only spying/collecting information for the Sadducee & Pharisee headquarters back in Jerusalem, so that the Temple authorities can gain control of John or discredit his ministry. The 'Jerusalem Authorities' are not serious about preparatory change, and anticipating the Messiah. (Imagine that: Can those in power tolerate a faithful servant of God out there preaching the coming Kingdom? Never going to happen.)

Now, John is fully aware of the popularity of baptism, and the wonderful response he receives from the people. BUT, John knows his humble little place as a messenger and 'prelude' to the Messiah's coming. John knows that he is only the 'opening act' of salvation. Jesus the Christ is the Main Showing. John doesn't want any confusion about his minor role, which is why we have his threefold denial of any claim to fame which is thrown at him in today's gospel. In today's gospel. Three times John humbly testifies, "I am not anything – you need to meet/know the Messiah". John 1:20-21, tells us that "John admitted and did not deny it, but admitted, "I am not the Messiah." So, they asked him, "What are you then? Are you Elijah?" And he said, "I am not." "Are you the Prophet?" He answered, "No". The humility of John really shines when even at the point that John opens his mouth to go on record as to who he is, John only quotes the words of a n ancient prophet, Isaiah 40:3, (not even using his own words). He plagiarizes (not original), using Isaiah's words, John describing his work as "the voice of one crying out 'Make straight the way of the Lord." And John's humility continues when he basically says, "I am as common as water!" (John 1:26). Finally, John (1:27) humbly bows out of the scene by saying, "the one who is coming after me, his sandal strap I am not worthy to untie." What John means by this sandal strap comment is simply John's additional humility. Because, even more that just saying, 'I can't fill his shoes', John goes on to say 'I am so lowly, I would dirty him up even trying to untie his shoes.' Yet, before his actual death at the hands of King Herod's men, John does definitively bow out of public life right before his arrest when in John 3:30, John announces, "I must decrease while He (Jesus) must increase."

What was John Baptist's ministry and purpose? What did he do for them & us waiting for Jesus?

- 1) Stir up our conscience to turn back to God Repent Admit sin/guilt and make amends
- 2) Turn people to study the words of the ancient prophets' teaching (conversion)
- 3) Always points us to Jesus (and away from one's own self)
- 4) Be dutiful about one's work with contentment (no flair, no attention but to simple duty)

As a final note, that question thrown at John the Baptist of, "Who are you?" must have been a common one in gospel times. We will hear it also addressed to Jesus several times. Another place in particular found in John's gospel happens while Jesus is teaching about the Heavenly Father. In John 8:25 we hear that, "The Jewish Pharisees, said to Jesus, "Who are you?" Another similar question is pushed to Jesus, after He cleanse the Temple, the chief priests and elders asked him, "Who gave you this authority to do these things?" (Mark 11:28 – like 'who do you think you are?'). Pilate at Jesus' trial asked Him similarly, "Where are you from?" (John 19:9). Yet, I think that question asked of Jesus and of John Baptist, could just as well be asked of us to motivate us to repent. Who are we, really? Are we disciples of Jesus or not? Do we identify with Christ (accept him) or claim to be our own God (denying Jesus)? Considering what we think of ourselves, could we get past our own self-conceptions and ambitions to recognize Jesus when he comes? Something to pray about. Peace, Fr Brian
