## What is a Wedge?

It's what you west coasters call a hoagie/ sub/ hero, but not. A Wedge is chewy and has a "pull/tug" to it when you take a bite. The name Wedge is short for sandwich... the term originated at Landi's Deli on Willow Street in Yonkers, NY during the 1920's. Antonio and Concetta Landi, then their son Frank, ran the place. Anyhow, it's pretty simple......
Concetta never spoke a word of English and she started calling sandwiches "wiches" or wedges... it stuck with the customers and because they served the best wedges then and now (if they were still around) the name spread locally.....there you go.
