THIS DATE IN HISTORY

- Sept 7, 1951 The U.S. signs an agreement with Saigon for direct aid to South Vietnam. American presence in Saigon is increased as civilian government employees join the U.S. military already there.
- Sept 8, 1954 An agreement is signed at Manila establishing a military alliance that becomes the Southeast Asia Treaty Organization (SEATO), aimed at checking Communist expansion. Those signing are U.S., France, Great Britain, Australia, New Zealand, Philippines, Pakistan and Thailand.
- Sept 21, 1961 The U.S. Army's 5th Special Forces Group is activated at Fort Bragg, NC. They will deploy to South Vietnam and assume control of all Special Forces operation in country.
- Sept 1, 1963 The U.S. Army establishes the 145th Aviation Battalion in Vietnam.
- Sept 9, 1964 Soviets warn Japan that it must expect some military retaliation if it allows U.S. bases there to be used for military action against North Vietnam.
- Sept 30, 1964 First large scale anti-war demonstration in the U.S. is staged at University of California-Berkeley by students and faculty oppose to the war.
- Sept 15, 1965 To affirm their loyalty to the government of South Vietnam, 500 Montagnards turn over their weapons at a ceremony in Ban Me Thuot.
- Sept 1, 1966 The U.S. 11th Armored Cavalry Regiment deploys to Vietnam from Fort Meade, Maryland, to conduct combat operations in III Corps.

9/11 20 Year Dedication Ceremony



POW/MIA Remembrance Day Ceremony

Friday evening, September 17th, from 7:30-10:00pm is a Watchfire event with a solemn ceremony at the north side of the Indiana War Memorial, 55 East Michigan St, Indy. On street parking is free.

Saturday, September 18th will be the ceremony will be held on the north steps of the Indiana War Memorial. A preceremonial concert is scheduled at 11:30am with the program beginning at 12:00pm noon.

9/11 Timeline of Events

- 7:59 AM: American Airlines Flight 11 takes off from Boston, Massachusetts, carrying 11 crew members, 76 passengers, and 5 hijackers.
- 8:15 AM: United Airlines Flight 175 takes off from Los Angeles, California, carrying 9 crew members, 51 passengers, and 5 hijackers.
- 8:19 AM: Flight 11 crew members contact ground personnel to report a hijacking underway onboard the flight.
- 8:20 AM: American Airlines Flight 77 takes off from Dulles, Virginia, carrying 6 crew members, 53 passengers, and 5 hijackers.
- 8:24 AM: A hijacker on Flight 11 accidentally broadcasts a message to air traffic control. The transmission is heard by Victor J. Saracini of Flight 175; he reports the message to the FAA mere minutes before his own plane is hijacked.
- 8:37 AM: Boston's air traffic control center alerts the USAF's Northeast Air Defense Sector of the hijacker's transmissions. Jets from the National Guard are mobilized.
- 8:42 AM: United Airlines Flight 93 takes off from Newark, New Jersey, carrying 7 crew members, 33 passengers, and 4 hijackers.
- 8:46 AM: Flight 11 crashes into the North Tower of the World Trade Center, impacting floors 93 through 99. All 3 emergency stairwells are severed on impact. Emergency responders are immediately sent to the site to begin evacuation efforts.
- 8:50 AM: The U.S. President is made aware of the attacks during his visit to an elementary school in Sarasota, Florida. President Bush and his advisors, at this time, are under the assumption that it was a tragic accident.
- 8:52 AM: A flight attendant on Flight 175 notifies a United Airlines operator that a hijacking is underway.
- 9:02 AM: The evacuation of the South Tower is announced over the PA system to the people in the South Tower.
- 9:03 AM: Flight 175 crashes into the South Tower of the World Trade Center, impacting floors 77 through 85. 2 of the 3 emergency stairwells are severed on impact, along with the disabling of the elevator.
- 9:03 AM: Emergency responders escalate the response effort, shutting down airspace over New York City. By this time, over 2,000 officers are deployed.
- 9:05 AM: President Bush is alerted of the second plane crashing into the World Trade Center.
- 9:12 AM: Passengers on Flight 77 begin contacting their family. One passenger contacts her husband, the U.S. Solicitor General, who in turn alerts federal officials.
- 9:37 AM: Flight 77 crashes into the Pentagon. The crash and fire kills 125 military and civilian personnel on the ground.
- 9:59 AM: The South Tower begins to collapse. After burning for 56 minutes, it takes only 10 seconds to collapse.
- 10:03 AM: Flight 93 crashes into a field near Shanksville in Somerset County, Pennsylvania. The plane was 20 minutes away from Washington D.C.
- 10:15 AM: The damaged section of the Pentagon's west-facing outer ring collapses.
- 10:28 AM: After burning for an hour and 42 minutes, the North Tower collapses.
- 12:16 PM: All U.S. flights are grounded.
- 5:20 PM: A nearby apartment building, 7 World Trade Center, collapses. There are no casualties.
- 8:30 PM: President Bush addresses the Nation. He announces that the full resources of the intelligence and law enforcement communities are being directed to find those responsible for the attacks.

Afternoon of September 12th: The last survivor is rescued.

Rural Veterans Mental Health Legislation Bill Now Law

The Sgt. Ketchum Rural Veterans Mental Health Act expands a VA mental health program for veterans living in rural areas of the country. Marine Corps Sgt. Brandon Ketchum is the namesake of the law. He died by suicide in 2016. The VA hospital in Iowa City, Iowa, turned away the Ketchum when he sought care for post-traumatic stress and drug abuse disorders, according to the Des Moines Register. After a VA psychiatrist dismissed Ketchum, the 33 year old drove to his home in Davenport, Iowa, and ended his life. For more info on this law, go to ruralhealth.va.gov


