Pastor's Study Desk Notes



Dear St Anthony & St Pius Families,

1st Sunday Lent Yes

Mark 1:12-14

What do you do in the desert? Only what is necessary! The desert focuses our attention, unlike anything else. It is isolating, and discomforting. Yet, doesn't that make us tune in and perk up to what is around us. Jesus goes into the desert to intensively concentrate on His identity and relation to the Father & Spirit (commune with them) and train for His mission and ministry. Mark's gospel even hints at dangers for Jesus. Being out there for an extended period (40 days – isn't one night enough?), Mark adds that there are nefarious visitors awaiting Him. such as, yes, rattlesnakes and scorpions, but Mark also says "Satan" & "Wild Beasts" visit Jesus (Mark 1:13). As if the rugged terrain and harsh climate were not challenging enough, there are also active predators. So, why does Jesus go into the desert? It is not just a daring 'He-Man' contest show of virility. No, Jesus is more interested in the purifying effects of solitude and focus upon his mission and identity. Recall, that just before He is 'driven by the Spirit' (Mark 1:12) into the desert, He had just been baptized by John. His baptism was quite the revelatory scene with the 'heavens being torn open and a dove descending upon him', with a heavenly voice declaring, 'You are my beloved Son, with whom I am well pleased' (Mark 1:10-11). I suggest that such a dramatic experience demands some time to process. It calls for a period of debriefing, before taking any further steps. So, the Spirit leads Jesus into the desert, as an incubatory period to reflect upon what it means to be called the pleasing 'Son of God' along with those accompanying signs in the sky (maybe a new holiday song could be written, 'On the second day of baptism, my true love sent to me..... first, heavens halfing, second, doves descending....). So, the purpose of Jesus' desert retreat is for Him to focus on His identity and consolidate His missionary approach and message. It will clarify for Him what the Father's Kingdom looks like and what words He will use to express it as well as what actions He will undertake to display it for others. Often we say that Jesus communes with the Father and Holy Spirit in the desert, deepening His identity with them. Such communion includes reflecting upon the Old Testament prophecy that He is fulfilling, and how He will now be teaching and demonstrating God's Kingdom come in His own Person. Maybe His desert conference can be understood as a type of planning period before He is called to duty. In Luke's gospel (4:187-21) we do find such an immediate reporting to work and rolling out of Jesus' 'Mission Statement' and 'Proof of Concept' for the Kingdom of God, actually happening right after His desert retreat. Why doesn't Mark include these additional scenes? Why does Mark not tell about Jesus' in-person presentation of His Strategy Notes on Ot prophecy fulfillment, at an inaugural visit to His home synagogue like Luke's Gospel does (or why does Mark not give the details of three separate temptations in desert?) Again, we remember that Mark is sparse with details since he is writing under the chaotic threat of the Roman takeover of Jerusalem and destruction of the Temple following the catastrophic uprising of the Jews in 66-70 AD. Mark keeps to the basics-only the essentials! I think Mark would be at home in the desert in that way. He focuses us on what is most important about the desert. 1) Jesus communes with the Father & Spirit, strengthening His sense of Identity, and 2) His resolve to fulfill the Will of God, reveal the Kingdom Way of God on Earth. Like an intense training camp, the desert period clarifies Jesus' mission and equips Him with the spiritual resources needed to 'adapt, improvise and overcome' any future obstacles/attacks the 'Devil or beasts' will hurl at Him in His ministry. I am sure that Jesus refers back often, in his own mind, to this desert refuge, as He undergoes all of His later mission work and experiences that we will read about in the rest of the gospels.

I find this 40 day desert retreat of Jesus to be the motivation for our forty day period of Lent, preceding Easter. This is a time for us to retreat, reflect, repent and restore anything we can, to better our discipleship with Jesus. We traditionally use the spiritual tools of prayer, fasting and almsgiving to help birth the new life of Christ in us. Easter celebrates that risen life of grace in us. So, we increase our prayer or add new forms of prayer to challenge ourselves to live closer to Christ. We voluntarily take on sacrifice like fasting, to give up some thing or some habit to open up more opportunities for us to experience God. Since prayer and sacrifice liberates us, we then have more resources and time to charitably serve others (because what I have given up, I now have, to be able to give to another person).

St Paul outlines the fruit of a good Lent when he writes in Romans 6:8 "If, then, we have died with Christ, we believe that we shall also live with him." Peace, Fr Brian
