47th Annual Rosary March

The Clearfield Chapter of The World Apostolate of Fatima (The Blue Army) extends an invitation to join us at the 47th Annual Rosary March on Sunday May 5th at 3 p.m., at the Clearfield County Fair Grounds in Clearfield, PA (just off route 322).

The Rosary March will take place inside the Expo I Building with the Rosary Procession taking place outside, weather permitting. The Rosary March will begin with the Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament, immediately followed by the Rosary and Eucharistic Procession. It is not necessary that you process if you would like to remain seated inside the Expo I Building. It is more important that we pray the Rosary publicly together as a community. The guest speaker at this year's Rosary March will be Fr. James Davidson. Fr. Families and the Gospel

April 21, 2024, Fifth Sunday of Easter (John 15:1-8)

Like the vine grower in today's gospel, parents must "prune and cleanse" the branches in their family if their children are going to be rooted. Discipline, limits and setting goals are a necessary part of parenting so our children will grow and "bear fruit." ("A Family Perspective" by Bud Ozar)

Stewardship Reflections

Our readings today teach us what it means to bear fruit as disciples of Christ. We hear in each of our readings that it is from the Lord that good effects will be produced in our lives. And Jesus clearly tells us how to do this in our Gospel, as He says, "I am the vine, you are the branches. Whoever remains in me and I in him will bear much fruit, because without me you can do nothing." We can remain in Christ by staying faithful to His commandments and frequently receiving the sacraments. And our day to day moments should be a reflection of those commitments.

Let us begin this week reflecting on these questions, 'how is God bearing fruit in my life?' and 'have I invited the Holy Spirit to work in my life?' Then let us consider the areas of our days that we can more fully invite the Lord into. May we strive to stay connected to the Vine.
