Topic: Every Child, Every Day: Meeting the Needs of Every Child through the IWCS Focus Documents

Presenter: Dr. James Thornton and Dr. Michael Lombardo – Isle of Wight County Schools

Conference Strand: Equity: Equitable practices in and out of the school building

Dr. James Thornton, Superintendent of Isle of Wight County Schools, will describe the process of meeting the needs of every child, every day by focusing on their individual unique gifts and talents in an effort to ensure each student is college, career and life ready. Dr. Thornton will share how educators in Isle of Wight County Schools developed and currently implement the division's focus documents within each instructional setting. Attendees will learn how to replicate similar focus documents within their own school or school division for the benefit of each student.

Topic: Promoting Literacy Through Equity: Leadership Practices and Resources for K-12 Teachers and Administrators

Presenter: Dr. Melanie Patterson, Dr. Laquiche Parrott, and Dr. Catrina Manigo – Norfolk Public Schools

Conference Strand: Equity: Equitable practices in and out of the school building

This session is designed to encourage and inform participants in developing partnerships with parents and community to promote pre-K-12 literacy through the equity lens of ACTION. The participants will be lead in several hands-on, motivational, movement activities that will inspire them to develop a culture of readers. Attendees will leave equipped with resources, ideas, and new practices that can be implemented in any school or grade level.

Topic: "Those Kids" Can't be Gifted! Developing and Identifying Gifted Students in a Focus School.

Statistical data and examples of classroom activities and technology integration will be provided.

Metompkin Elementary School is a Title I school with 86% of the population living in poverty. 38% of our student body are English Language Learners. As a leadership team, we began to brainstorm different ways to meet our community's needs. Through a professional book study from author/educator Dr. Steven Constantino, Engage Every Family, our team came up with new innovative ideas to reach families. We have been present at community events and have gone into neighborhoods with our Metompkin's Magical School Bus to provide "Pop-Up Workshops". In this session, we would share some of the ways we get community partnerships to help with our endeavors, but at the heart of it all is our teacher's willingness to volunteer their time on a Saturday.

Topic: Are they on the train?

Presenter: Jahkari Taylor and Rayvaugh Hines – Chesapeake Public Schools

This presentation puts forth an educational philosophy for meeting the unique needs of all students by creating an atmosphere of love where all students feel capable, connected, and cared for. It is referred to as "Relational Teaching" and it can be summarized as "Reach before you teach." Relational Teaching is rooted in social emotional learning, adolescent psychology, motivational theory, and practical experience in the K-12 education.

This session will explain the effects of stress on the brain, both chemically and physically; how stress affects learning capacity, school performance and quality of life. The good news is that this session also provides ways to learn to manage our own stress to self-regulate in order to help students learn to self-regulate their behavior. In addition, the session will offer practical, everyday ways to reduce stress in our lives and stay in "home state"...in other words....be happy.

There would be an escape room to complete as well as question and answer on how to adapt for individual school needs.

I have had the pleasure of attending on going professional development with Dan throughout the school year and have implemented his practices in our school with great success. He targets PK-2nd grade but I believe his practices are relevant for all elementary aged students.

Topic: Keeping up with Kindergarteners!

Participants will:

- Work in a group to design an effective classroom.
- Interact and explore with learning stations.
- Discuss the merits of various assessments.

Topic: Tune Tuesday – Using Music for Reading Engagement

Learning Walks provide teachers the opportunity to observe classrooms and reflect on the students' learning, instructional strategies used by teachers, and the classroom environment. Teachers have the opportunity to participate in informed dialogue about teaching and learning, expand teacher capacity, foster self-monitoring of professional growth, learn from one another, share best teaching practices, and create a climate of inquiry and growth.

In this session, participants will learn how to develop a learning walk program within a school or across schools within a division in order to foster a culture of teacher leadership and professional growth. Specific logistics as well as feedback from current teachers and administration participating in the program in VBCPS will be offered to give a clear picture as to how this can be a reality in any school/division.

Topic: Flippity – More Than Just a Sheet

Some of the most popular Flippity uses are creating flashcards, game shows, spelling tests, progress monitoring, and name spinners. By using Flippity, our school has had many successful and engaging lessons that have resulted in student growth. The knowledge and creative use of these programs enhance engagement for any audience, whether it is in professional development for staff or in a classroom for students. Session attendees, both beginners and experienced users, will be shown multiple uses for each content area and will be given a chance to download and work through Flippity with the help of the presenters. Technology that will be used will include a Promethean or Smart Board and Chromebooks (or laptop with Chrome loaded).

Topic: Riding the STREAM: Integrating Language Arts and STEM

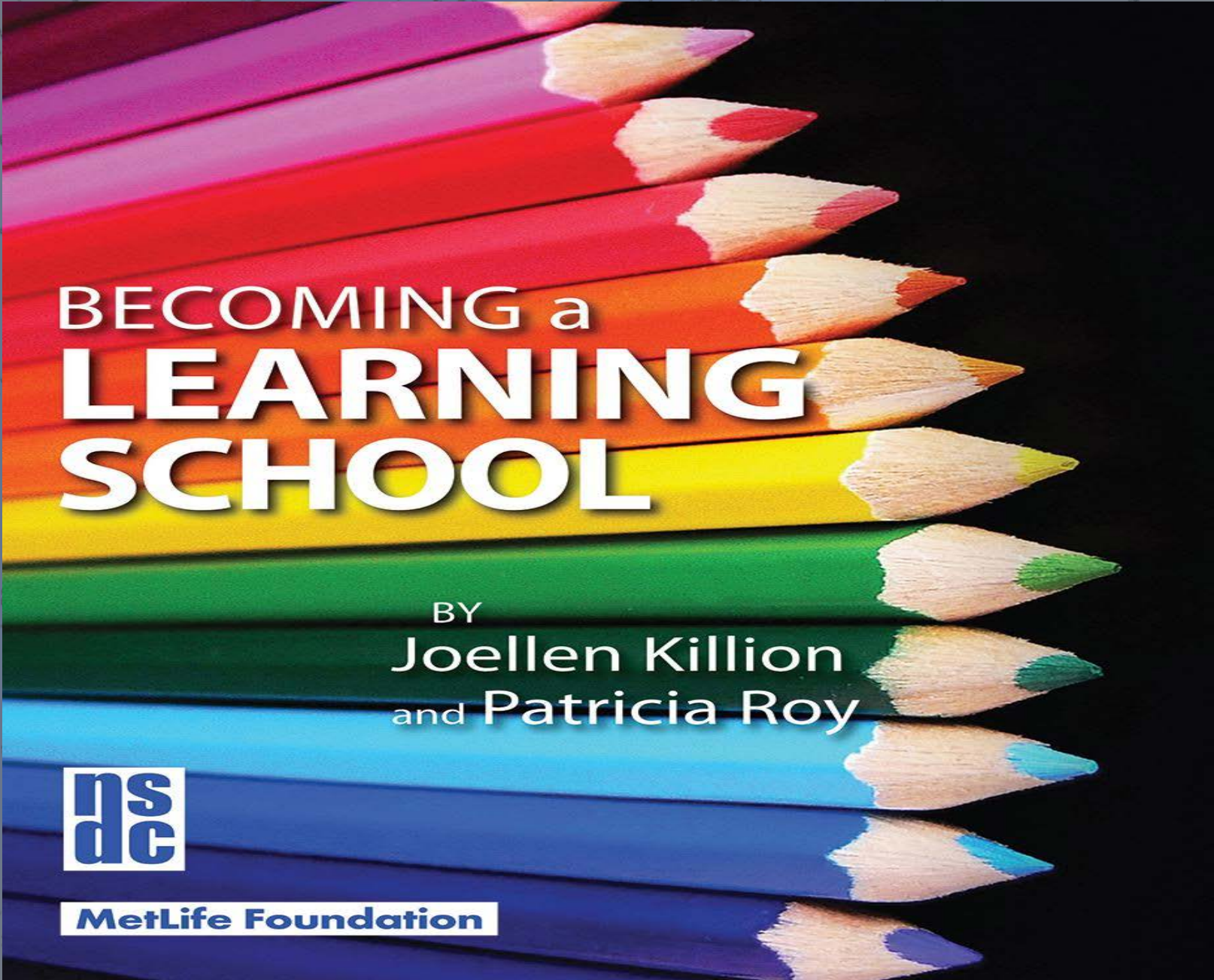
