


AT FEATHER LAKE



common Grasshopper Sparrow and Baird's Sparrow. We will be looking for birds that spend the cold months in grassland habitat. In the Sunland Park and Upper Valley area we will be looking for overwintering water birds and land birds.

Bosque del Apache, National Wildlife Refuge and Rosy-Finch Field Trip

Get ready for Sandhill Cranes, Snow Geese and ducks at Bosque del Apache NWR, which is one of the more popular national wildlife refuges in the country. Bald Eagles are commonly seen there as well. Mark and Janet will be in the area on Friday, January 13 for birding and viewing of the fly-in. All are welcome to join them.

On Saturday, January 14, the group will view the fly-out and bird the area that day. Last year, we had great views of a wild bobcat who posed at length for photos and a large herd of elk! A group dinner is planned, details to follow.


