In addition to these mostly very old readings/topics, I expect you to have read articles in use organizational theory from the past 5-7 years of the most important journals in sociology and management: *ASR*, *AJS*, *SF*, *ASQ*, *Org Sci*. For *Org Sci*, you should focus on org theory articles and ignore articles in related fields like strategy. You should also be aware of articles that seem important in *AMJ* – e.g., because they are highly cited – but be aware that *AMJ* publishes a lot of mediocre articles.
