I am currently working on the last phase of an update to the Wheatland Directory. Gathering data, confirming information, and editing the database



Scripture Reading – Matthew 6:5-15 (NRSV)



- 7 'When you are praying, do not heap up empty phrases as the Gentiles do; for they think that they will be heard because of their many words. 8Do not be like them, for your Father knows what you need before you ask him.
- 9 'Pray then in this way:

Our Father in heaven,

hallowed be your name.

10 Your kingdom come.

Your will be done,

on earth as it is in heaven.

- 11 Give us this day our daily bread.
- 12 And forgive us our debts, as we also have forgiven our debtors.
- 13 And do not bring us to the time of trial, but rescue us from the evil one.

14For if you forgive others their trespasses, your heavenly Father will also forgive you; 15but if you do not forgive others, neither will your Father forgive your trespasses.

Life of Faith

The following excerpts from "Luther's Small Catechism." This translation is featured in the ELW. The full Small Catechism can be found in the back of that hymnal.

"The First Petition

Our Father in heaven. What does this mean?

With these words God wants to attract us, so that we come to believe he is truly our Father and we are truly his children, in order that we may ask him boldly and with complete confidence, just as loving children ask their loving father.

The Third Petition

Your will be done on earth as in heaven.

What does this mean?

In fact, God's good and gracious will comes about without our prayer, but we ask in this prayer that it may also come about in and among us.

How does this come about?

Whenever God breaks and hinders every evil scheme and will—as are present in the will of the devil, the world, and our flesh that would not allow us to hallow God's name and would prevent the coming of his kingdom, and instead whenever God strengthens us and keeps us steadfast in his word and in faith until the end

of our lives. This is God's gracious and good will.

The Fourth Petition

Give us today our daily bread. *What does this mean?*

In fact, God gives daily bread without our prayer, even to all evil people, but we ask in this prayer that God cause us to recognize what our daily bread is and to receive it with thanksgiving.

What then does "daily bread" mean?

Everything included in the necessities and nourishment for our bodies, such as food, drink, clothing, shoes, house, farm, fields, livestock, money, property, an upright spouse, upright children, upright members of the household, upright and faithful rulers, good government, good weather, peace, health, decency, honor, good friends, faithful neighbors, and the like.

The Fifth Petition

Forgive us our sins, as we forgive those who sin against us. *What does this mean?*

We ask in this prayer that our heavenly Father would not regard our sins nor deny these petitions on their account, for we are worthy of nothing for which we ask, nor have we earned it. Instead we ask that God would give us all things by grace, for we daily sin much and indeed deserve only punishment. So, on the other hand, we, too, truly want to forgive heartily and to do good gladly to those who sin against us.

Questions for Reflection

Share the story of when you first learned or remember hearing the Lord's Prayer. How does prayer impact your life? How might prayer impact the congregation?

Prayer

Our Father, who art in heaven, hallowed be thy name, thy kingdom come, thy will be done, on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread; and forgive us our trespasses, as we forgive those who trespass against us; and lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil. For thine is the kingdom, and the power, and the glory, forever and ever. Amen.

We met with groups from St. Philip Lutheran Church, St Marks Lutheran Church, Member One Federal Credit Union, and Wheatland Volunteers on 5/15/2022 for an afternoon of planting. The gathering of all the people was such a success we did in 1.5 hours what would normally take us 5 hours, and enjoyed building community while doing it. We have 90% of our crops planted! We have Tomatoes, Cucumbers, Yellow Squash, Zucchini, Watermelon, Broccoli, and Peppers. We will plant some fall Squash, and Sweet Potatoes will be planted in June. Virginia Tech is meeting at the garden the morning of 5/25/22 to talk about raising another pumpkin patch and Poblano Peppers. I am attaching some recent pictures for you to see

how wonderful this is going.











Update 5/26/22: Met with Virginia Tech Agriculture Department Horticulturist on Wednesday May 25, 2022. They are joining us again this year to grow pumpkins for Tractor treat; they will grow several varieties that we can then have to hand out for Jack-O-Lanterns. In addition to that, they are planting a couple varieties that will grow to Epic Size!! For Fun. Another study they will be performing is the study of growing Poblano Peppers (4 different kinds). The team from VT along with Kate Lawrence (VA extension agent) will help make sure our plants keep healthy and Happy. It is so wonderful to be doing this project for Community with the Community.

It certainly does not apply to **Jake Phillips**, a former prep superstar at Bath County High School who was hired May 3rd as the Chargers' new head football coach and athletic director. Jake is the son-in-law of Wheatland members Pam and Steve Austin; he is married to their daughter Kasey.

"Bath County gave me so much growing up," Jake said. "I absolutely loved growing up that way. I'm really excited for a chance to give back. It's exciting to be close to family. It's exciting to be home."

Jake was a three-sport star at Bath County, leading the football team to a 49-5 overall record, a VHSL Group A Division championship in 2001 and state runner-up finishes in 2000 and 2003.

Jake has been the head coach at Staunton High — formerly called Robert E. Lee — for the past three seasons. Prior to coaching, the former William and Mary quarterback played professionally for the Green Bay Blizzard of the Indoor Football League.

Bath County has a projected enrollment of 148 in 2022-23, the smallest school in the VHSL that plays varsity football and the third smallest high school in the state.

Jake plans to move his family from Waynesboro, and said he will have classroom responsibilities during half of the school day at Bath. We welcome Jake, Kasey, and their children back to beautiful Bath County.
