A friend presented me with something I have never seen before. It was three pieces of "sea glass".

They are discarded glass bottles that have been carelessly tossed in the ocean as litter. But over a period of 7 to 10 years, the sea waters smooth the sharp edges of the broken glass, and give it an opaque frosting. The ocean takes broken trash, and creates beautiful treasures.

What the ocean does for glass, God does for us. Where some might see as trash, God sees as a treasure. In spite of the broken pieces, God sees beautiful potential. 
June 3, 10 June 17 9:30, Rehearsal 10:00, Warm up and Sing
