Spiritual Lessons from the Quarantine

— We've made some important discoveries during this time of limited travel and activity!

As trying as this time of separation and limitations has been, many of us have learned some new things, and remembered some important old things during these last few weeks.

iChurch: It's been amazing to see how quickly so many churches have used technology in new ways. We often think of the church as being pretty "old school" and limited when it comes to technology, but the church's use of electronic channels to reach people has taken a leap forward. And as a result, millions of people who had no church connection have gotten a taste of the celebration, the good news, and the joy that we share every week.

Family time: Many families have rediscovered in-home family activities: watching a movie together and snacking on popcorn, gathering around the firepit at night, pulling out the old board games or making up new games to play together.

Need vs Want: Many people and families have saved money. They

haven't had to buy as many restaurant meals, tanks of gas, or other expensive activities as they hung out together at home. Or they have cut back intentionally due to income concerns... and they're considering maintaining some of these changes once the virus concerns are over.

The importance of face-to-face: Some of us need a lot of human interaction. Others need less. But we all need some. There is a hunger in our hearts for being face to face with others, for the touch of a friend. Even though we live in this online world, our interactions through Twitter, Facebook, video, and texting do not meet that need.

So church leaders everywhere are asking, "What have we learned that should shape how we do ministry in the days to come?" It's a question we'll be discussing for some time, but here are some things I think we need to consider:

Digital outreach extends our touch! We know that some of our church members did not see our online worship broadcasts, but we



still had 300, 350, maybe even 400 people watching those worship videos each Sunday. Our influence was *doubled*. So even after we can assemble, we need to find ways to produce digital content that will meet the needs of those who aren't in our building.

Fellowship matters a LOT. You can get a sermon on TV, on the internet... You can hear worship music on the radio, or see a Christian band or choir on YouTube. But there is something powerful, something that meets a deep need, when we gather as a family. So when we "take a Sunday off" we are robbing others of something precious and powerful, both in the giving and the receiving.


So what has this time apart, time away from worship and small group gatherings, taught you about your faith and spiritual life?

Bridging the gap between our online worship and when we are able to gather in our church building, we are diving into a series called "Faith that Works." We will be looking at 3 essential beliefs we have about God... but that, sadly, fail to always show up in our lives.

When our talk about our faith in God doesn't match our walk with God and our daily life, we are the worst kind of witness. We are actually pushing people away from Jesus through our inconsistent or contradictory living.



So each week we will be looking at one of these essential beliefs. Then, if everything goes as we hope it will, we will be able to gather for worship on Sunday, May 3, and we will get back to our series in the book of Genesis, "Re:Start."
