Pastor's Study **Desk Notes**



Dear St Anthony & St Pius Families,

Baptism of the Lord

Year C Luke 3:15-16, 21-22

Set Fire to the Rain! Yet, it is not Adele, but John the Baptist singing! People are talking, and 'Rumor has it' that John might be the Messiah? But 'Hello', John knows himself, and humbly steps back from the light to reveal that he is only an opening act (Yes, I took up the challenge to see how many Adele song titles I can use!) But John Baptist only prepares, and makes ready for the coming 'Way' of Jesus. The real 'Skyfall' happens after John, when Jesus is baptized by him and the Holy Spirit-Dove descends upon Jesus with the voice of the Father announcing, "You are my beloved son..." John is a model of discipleship. John does not want to attract any attention to himself, but only wants to make the introductions of people to Jesus, and then he steps back out of view. Water is used for preparations. We see this when we bathe or wash our faces in the morning, to get ready to face the light of day. Or when we rinse and wash vegetables before actually putting them in the pot/stove. Then, we are cooking with fire! The same applies to our faith: John prepares us with water, but it is Jesus who brings the fire to us.

As a disciple, John knows he needs a Messiah (and John wants no confusion: He is not it—in John 1:20, the Baptist will definitively deny it *three* times!) To emphasize his humility, John uses an interesting symbolic action of 'not even being worthy to untie Jesus' sandal'. What is that about? How is not untying a shoe, a sign of lowly humility. Well first, it is not just anybody's shoe, but it is the Messiah's sandal. Since it was customary that only a slave did such 'grunt' work as removing a person's shoes and washing their feet. John even debases himself lower than a slave's status by his remark about not being worthy to even touch the strap of the Messiah's sandal. Such sandal and foot work certainly could make the list of Mike Rowe's TV Show' 'Dirty Jobs'. It was lowly work, dealing with the lowest part of body and the slave knelt low to the ground, or stooped in front of the master to do the work (and consider where those sandals and toes may have walked, with all the animals running around, toe jam, etc!) So, here comes John and he says he is not even worthy to 'untie' the strap on Messiah's sandal. It is not that he is saying, he is not worthy to rub/touch the Master's body-- He is saying that he is not worthy to touch something (strap) that touches something (sandal) that actually touches the Master's body (and only foot at that!). That is lowly and humble!

But John's exaggeration is to help his followers readily and eagerly leave him and begin discipleship to the Messiah-Jesus when He appears. We may underestimate such a possibility. How could someone stick with John and miss the Messiah? Keep in mind that John was quite popular. Matthew 14:5 tells us that Herod's fear of John was due to his popularity among the people. John has disciples that claimed loyalty to him which can be seen when the Pharisees reference John's disciples fasting in Luke 5:33. An eventual apostle of Jesus, Andrew, was first a disciple of John (John 1:37). So, it was likely hard for his devoted friend-disciples to transition in to becoming Jesus' disciples, even though John's whole mission was to accomplish such an acceptance of the Messiah (so often with prophets, we mistake the messenger for the message). Here are two examples of how John humbly moved his disciples over to Jesus (Maybe imagine it as a mother bird pushing the babies out of the nest to fly): In Matt 11:2– 11 (Lk 7:18–28), John sends some 'clingers-on' of his to take a mission to go meet Jesus and ask the question, "Are you the one who is to come, or should we look for another?" Of course John knows, and Jesus knows that John knows, but to help the loyal 'holdouts' come over, John forces an 'introduction' knowing that Jesus divine charisma would draw them into new discipleship. Again, John properly defers to Jesus, when Jesus presents Himself for baptism from John. John's aides would have heard the exchange, when John resists such an act, saying "I need to be baptized by you, and yet you are coming to me?" (Matt 3:13-14).

So, John is humble and the exemplary servant, to do his job and step back out of the way. John himself will say, "He must increase, and I must decrease" (John 3:30). Peace, Fr Brian
