Gaming News

Cosmopolitan Sold

On and off the market over the years, the Cosmopolitan of Las Vegas has been sold. In a deal that's emblematic of casino turnover these days, New Yorkbased Blackstone, Inc., the global investment business, is selling the operations of Cosmo to MGM Resorts for \$1.63 billion and the building to a partnership among a Blackstone real-estate investment trust and two other investment groups for \$4 billion, for a total of \$5.65 billion, a half-billion or so over the latest asking price. MGM will lease the building for 30 years, with three 10-year options to renew, and pay \$200 million in annual rent with 2%-3% annual rent raises.

Blackstone picked up the Cosmo from Deutsche Bank in 2014 for \$1.8 billion and invested a few hundred million in upgrades; according to the Wall Street Journal, it's "the most profitable single asset in Blackstone's history." For its part, MGM will now control the operations of the five casinos on the west side of the Strip between Flamingo Road and Tropicana Avenue.

City of the Future?

Fifty-year-old Marc Lore, founder of Jet.com, which was bought out by Walmart for \$3.3 billion, then served as the president of Walmart for a few years, envisions a \$400 billion 150,000-acre five-million-population city of the future to be built somewhere in the Southwest of Nevada. Dubbed Telosa (from the Greek telos, meaning "higher purpose"). "The shining city

in the desert sounds to us like the BleuTech boondoggle on steroids," says the Las Vegas Advisor, adding that the difference is, Lore has billions to back his ambitions and has already hired the architectural firm Bjarke Ingels Group, which specializes in the future of urban living. The mission statement for Telosa is to create an "equitable and sustainable future" that can "become a blueprint of future generations," employing eco-friendly architecture, sustainable energy, a drought-resistant water system, and "Georgist" principles (anyone can build and own structures, but the city retains land ownership). The plan is to start with a \$25 billion investment to support 50,000 residents by 2030; the total build-out would be completed by

Jumbo Bingo

A Jumbo Bingo jackpot worth more than a quarter million dollars hit this past September at Green Valley Ranch in Henderson, Nevada. The guest, who was not identified in a news release from the resort, covered their entire card on the 53rd number called. The jackpot paid \$255,166. During Station Casinos' Jumbo Bingo games, players are given cards with the even numbers already covered so the announcer only calls odd numbers. It's the largest jumbo progressive to hit since Jumbo Bingo was relaunched in 2018, according to the resort.

Betsy's Bingo Show


Shea's Smith Theater of Buffalo, New York roared back to life with their winning show, Betsy Charmichael's Bingo Palace, in which the audience got into the act with special games, prizes, fun and surprises. The show was created by Joey Bucheker and Mary Kate O'Connell, based on a character created by Bucheker and directed by O'Connell. Bucheker plays Betsy Carmichael, who resides over the Palace as the self-ordained "first lady of Bingo." Decked out in a floral print muumuu and retro eyeglasses, Besty is like a cross between a Golden Girl and a Catholic schoolteacher according to one critic. Upon entering the theater, patrons were presented with a Bingo card. Bucheker then guided them through games, giving out prizes, and launching candies into the crowd. Bucheker said of his creation: "She's a genuinely happy person. She's witty. And sees the best in people...and is always looking to have a good time."

Lucky Local

One lucky Las Vegas local, Miguel, won big at Arizona Charlie's taking home a Bingo prize of \$57,799 on Charlie's Double Progressive Bingo at a recent 1 p.m. session. Players can sign up for True Rewards, Golden Entertainment's rewards program, to receive bonuses including increased point multipliers, prizes such as cash and free slot play, as well as eligibility in select tournaments and special events. Texans Fight Game Rooms

Corpus Christi's non-profits and charitable Bingo hall advocates are pleading with local officials to shut down area game rooms. At a recent city council meeting, a group of people voiced their concerns explaining that every time a game room opens, the city, county and non-profits lose money. Advocates reminded all in attendance that Bingo halls pay taxes and give money to charity. "They're doing good things with the communities they are in and this is being hurt (by unregulated game rooms)," said Eddie Heinemeyer, a former chairman of Texas Charity Advocates. Attendees claim a single game room takes in anywhere between \$25,000 to \$50,000 per week so they're not little nickel and dime outfits. Several law enforcement raids were conducted at game rooms in the past, but within a month, council members contend, they opened right back up again. Members of the council went on to urge the passage of an ordinance making game rooms illegal, and if not that they be required to obtain a license and be regulated.

Bob Bungles Bingo, Part One

During the twenty-one years that I have written this monthly Bingo column, I have always wanted to be a full-fledged Bingo CALLER. Well, it finally happened. And, you know...it was a lot more WORK than I anticipated.

As you know—now that I have moved back to my hometown in southern Indiana—I have been playing Bingo in the same grade school cafeteria where I first played in 1957. Recently, the guy who runs the games asked me if I would like to become the Friday night official Bingo caller. I immediately agreed. The next week I went into training. I quickly found that being a Bingo caller was mostly WORK and not that much FUN.

I had prepared a "work sheet" to use each week when I would "solo" as a caller. But I never imagined when a disappointing job I would do. I failed miserably.

Over the years, the old Bingo hall has added a lot of gimmicks and quirks that most halls don't have. The Early Bird session is



divided into two parts: The Early-Early Bird and the Early Bird. Now, that might not seem confusing until you realize that the first games are all Double Bingo with a Wild Number. And, friends, telling the equipment what the wild number is isn't easy.

The session starts at 6 p.m. By the time 6:30 came and we were getting ready to switch to the "normal" Single Bingo Early Bird games, I was ready to throw in the towel. My teacher was very supportive, but I felt clumsy and I was slowing the evening and I knew the audience knew that I was in a "world of hurt."

Now, before the regular session there is an added level of complexity that I was not prepared for. This hall awards cow bells

(don't laugh) to five different people before the main games. The bells go to anyone who has a birthday or whose name is called from entries submitted when people bought their packs. Each winner of a bell picks his or her own favorite number. The caller has to list those. Each time a person's number is called, they ring their bell and one of the runners has to pay them five or ten dollars, depending on which size bell they were awarded.

The bottom line: Old Bob FAILED as a caller. I really feel badly about that. Next month I'll continue my saga. In the meanwhile, stay well and keep playing Bingo. And, the next time your caller messes up, think of

Veterans **Post VA** Thieves **Never Learn**

Criminals just can't seem to help themselves when it comes to stealing from the Department of Veterans Affairs. What they haven't figured out is that they will eventually get caught.

In a despicable scheme, a New Jersey man has admitted to helping steal and then sell \$8.2 million in HIV drugs. One of his theft partners worked

in a VA hospital pharmacy and was discovered via surveillance footage. The thefts happened over the course of 27 months. How, we would like to know, could someone be allowed to walk out with \$8.2 million in drugs in her bag without being stopped by security?

The U.S. Attorney had a big day in arresting 16 people in a massive kickback-and-bribery scheme that included vendors and employees at two Florida VA hospitals. The \$20 million in thefts started in 2009 and wasn't discovered in audits. Their methods of theft and the charges were numerous and varied: inflating the cost of goods sold or shorting the orders, paying kickbacks, making purchases with VA credit cards, receiving bribes,

healthcare fraud and ordering from companies that didn't exist. The last of the band of thieves was recently sentenced.

In a smaller but equally important scheme, a Washington landlord admitted to scamming \$16,000 for HUD-VA housing for a homeless veteran. Not only was he billing the government for the monthly rent, but he was collecting from the veteran as well, a clear violation of the HUD-VASH program. For this he will get nailed for three times the amount he stole. The formerly homeless veteran will share in this and get a settlement of \$4,000.

The one big beef I have is that none of these criminals ever go to jail for very long.



Paws Corner

Q: My two cats, Mitsy and Bitsy, got along well for nearly five years. Bitsy is 11 years old, about six years older than Mitsy. In the past couple of months, they squall and squabble with each other every time they're in the same room. What is going on, and how do I stop it? - Cara C., Albuquerque, New Mexico

A: Take both of your cats to the veterinarian as soon as an appointment is available. Because the behavior just recently started after years of tranquility, a health issue could be at the root of their fighting.

Senior cats are especially likely to develop conditions that cause them to be cranky or more territorial than usual. Pain from arthritis or other conditions can be a big factor in making Bitsy irritable, tired and just not in the mood to hang out with Mitsy. Likewise, Mitsy could be developing a medical condition; it's best to rule out physical problems in both cats.

Once their health has been assessed and treatment, if necessary, started, then the hard work of reconciling the two can begin. Keep the cats separated at first — on opposite sides of

the house, if possible, in closed rooms. Each day, reintroduce them by placing a small plate of food in front of each door and letting them out. If they calmly eat, then the next day, move both plates closer. Observe the cats as they eat; if they begin to growl or tense up, put both back into their rooms before they escalate fighting is very traumatic for them. Shift the bowls back a bit and try again.


Dear LJ,

Static Over TV

Dear Aunt Bingo,

Recently, a Bingo hall had an end-of-the-month drawing for a 52-inch television. For each Bingo session buy-in during the month, you received one drawing ticket.

A friend of mine gave me the 13 tickets he earned throughout the month. He indicated that he had no need for a new TV and would not be in attendance the night of the drawing. (One rule of the drawing was that you must be present to win.)

I ended up winning the TV drawing, which upset a couple Bingo players who felt I was wrong for accepting drawing tickets I had not earned myself. Management said it is perfectly acceptable to give your tickets to someone else if you don't want or need them.

Reduce Food Waste In Your Child's Lunch Box

It's estimated that a family of four spends, on average, \$1,500 a year on food that goes uneaten—but you can help save food and money and improve your kids' health.

1.Get your children's input on what they like. Avoid "wish packing" foods that your child won't eat at home as these foods will likely be discarded at school. If clementines and turkey wraps are his thing, pack those. It is challenging to find the sweet spot between good nutrition and your child's preferences.

2.Cut up fruits and veggies so they are easy to eat. Most fruits

and vegetables are naturally low in fat, sodium, and calories. They provide many essential nutrients, including potassium, dietary fiber, folate, vitamin A, and vitamin C.

3.Make lunch fun. For example, add dips for cut veggies, make meat or cheese pinwheels and include dressing to add to a "shake and serve" salad.

4.Make sure to get the portions right for kids of different ages and sizes. USDA's MyPlate provides simple-to-use nutrition guidelines for allocating portions among food groups, such as one-quarter of the meal as

lean protein, one-quarter grains, and fruit and vegetables for the remaining half of the lunch.

5.Aim for "zero-waste lunches" by using reusable water bottles, containers, and snack bags, compostable cutlery, and bento-style lunch boxes.

6.Always keep food safety in mind. Some practices can reduce both food safety risks and food waste, such as using insulated lunch bags or boxes to keep fresh foods fresh and including reusable cold packs.

Collectors CornerMajolica

Q: How can I find out if my majolica plates are authentic and what their value is?

A: The term "majolica" was first used to describe tin-glazed earthenware made in Spain in the 14th century. Designs look painted on. A different kind of majolica, with molded designs, was made in England by Minton beginning in 1851. It became popular during the Victorian era and was made by manufacturers in several countries. Collectors look for Victorian majolica. Older pieces are heavier than reproduction majolica, the painting is more carefully done

and the body under the glaze is colored, not white.

Q: The metal drawer pulls on my antique dresser are marked "RD 769778, Made in England." I What can you tell me about it?

A: This number is an English design registry number and indicates the design for the hardware was registered in 1905. This helps date your dresser since it could not have been made before 1905. Look on the bottom or the back of the dresser for a maker's name or mark. It may give a better idea of age. The handles are copies of a 19th-century style.

Simple and **Inexpensive Final Farewells**

Dear Savvy Senior,

My husband and I are looking for the simplest and least expensive way to dispose of our bodies when we die. We hate the idea of wasting a lot of money on high-priced funerals and would like some advice on some simple and cheap send-offs. - Simple **Seniors**

Dear Simple,

With the average cost of a fullservice funeral running around \$11,000 today, many people are seeking simple ways to make their final farewell more affordable. Depending on how you want to go, here are several low-cost options to consider.

Direct Cremation

If you and your husband are interested in cremation, a direct cremation is the simplest and least expensive way to go. It includes picking up the body, completing and filing the necessary paperwork, the cremation itself and returning the cremated remains to the family. There's no embalming.

formal viewing or casket. A simple cardboard box called an "alternative container" is used to hold the body.

Depending on where you live and the funeral home you choose, the average cost for a direct cremation runs between \$1,000 and \$3,000. If you want additional services beyond what a direct cremation offers, ask the funeral home for an itemized price list that covers the other services offered, so you know exactly what you're getting. All providers are required by law to provide this.

To locate nearby funeral homes, look in your local yellow pages, or Google "cremation" or "funeral" followed by your city and state. You can also get good information online at <u>Parting.com</u>, which lets you compare prices from funeral providers in your area based on what you want.

Immediate or Direct Burial

If you're interested in being buried, an immediate/direct burial is the most basic and low-cost option. With an immediate burial, your body would be buried in a simple container shortly after death, skipping the embalming, viewing and use of the funeral facilities.

If your family wants a memorial service, they can have it at the graveside at your place of worship or at home without the body.

These services usually cost between \$1,800 and \$3,500, not counting cemetery charges, which can run you an additional \$1,000 to \$3,000. All funeral homes offer direct burial.

Green Burial

An eco-friendly green burial is another affordable way to go that costs anywhere from \$1,000 to \$4,000 depending on the provider. With a green cemetery burial, the body is buried in a biodegradable coffin or just wrapped in a shroud, without embalming chemicals or a burial vault.

The Green Burial Council (GreenBurialCouncil.org, 888-966-3330) has a state listing of cemetery operators who accommodate green burials, as well as funeral professionals who provide the services.

Anatomical Donation

If you'd like to eliminate your cremation/burial costs all together, as well as help advance medical research, you and your husband should consider donating your bodies to science. This option won't cost you a cent, however, some programs may charge a small fee to transport your body to their facility.

After using your body for medical research projects, anatomy lessons and surgical practice, your remains will be cremated and your ashes will be buried or scattered in a local cemetery or returned to your family, usually within a year.

Ask Dr. Roach: Janumet XR

Dear Dr. Roach,

I have been prescribed Janumet XR and am concerned if this drug is addictive. I do not want to be on this medication long-term. Can I get my diabetes under control by weight management and diet? -

Dear S.S.,

Janumet is a combination of Januvia (sitagliptin) and metformin (Glucophage). Together these drugs work to reduce sugar made by the liver and to increase release of insulin by the pancreas. Janumet is not addictive.

Many people are able to control diabetes through careful management of diet and weight control (exercise is the other important lifestyle management tool); however, depending on where your sugar levels have been, your doctor may have decided to put you on medication now to protect your body. It's possible for many patients to get off medications, but it requires a real commitment: a big change in diet and exercise, usually with significant weight loss.

Have you ever listened to a podcast? A podcast is a digital audio or video file that you can access from the internet. They're often in a series that you can tune into one at a time, almost like radio on demand. They're usually associated with a website where you can find out what's available and a schedule for new ones. You can listen or watch on your computer, phone or tablet, but you'll need an app (application) if you want to download and take it with you.

One way to find entertaining podcasts is to plug one of your areas of interest into a web browser and add "podcast" to see what comes up. Or as a place to start, look at AARP's website (www.aarp.org/podcasts) and see what it offers. Right now, there are podcasts about various scams, protecting your finances and high prescription-drug prices, all worth

If you search the internet for podcasts, you'll find vintage radio programs, celebrities, financial information, stories from history, news, brain stretchers, sports themes, stress reduction and so much more. Try a search for "podcasts for seniors" to see what surprises pop up.

Another way to keep your brain stretched is with online classes, called MOOCs, which stands for massive open online courses. There are thousands you can audit for free, attending remotely. You don't receive credit for audited classes. Coursera (www.coursera.org) is your go-to source for online learning. (At this writing, it lists 1,782 free courses from 200 universities.) Or see Edx (www.edx.org), co-founded by Harvard and MIT, for information on their 3,000 classes to audit for free. For more listings, see MOOCs at www.mooc.org.

Don't Reel in a Fish Too Quickly

Poker is sometimes like fishing. When you have a fish on the hook, you have to be careful not to let it off. A classic hand from the 2004 World Poker Tour Reno Hilton World Poker Challenge was a good example of this.

With just three players remaining from a 342-player field, the blinds were 10,000-20,000 when Mike Kinney raised to 60,000 from the button holding Ah Js. The late Paul "Eskimo" Clark folded 8d 3d from the small blind, and retired navy veteran Harry Knopp opted to defended his big blind with 8h 6h by calling 40,000.

The 2s Jd Jh flop didn't do anything for Knopp, and he checked it to Kinney, who had flopped trip jacks. Even though he hit the flop hard, Kinney checked it back.

Why didn't Kinney bet? Because he had a fish on the line and didn't want to set the hook too hard. Kinney had a monster hand and was looking to get paid, but what could Knopp have that would foreseeably pay Kinney off?

Most of the jacks were accounted for, so it was unlikely that Knopp had the missing one. Maybe he had a deuce in his hand, but even if he did, would he be willing to commit a lot of chips? In all likelihood, Knopp failed to connect with this flop -- which we know to be the case -- so Kinney was best served checking it back to allow a free turn card that might improve Knopp's hand. Even if it didn't, it would give Knopp the opportunity to bluff at it. Kinney had to reel him in slowly.

Well, as it happened, the dealer burned and turned the Jc, putting three of a kind on the board and giving Kinney quads. Knopp did in fact take the opportunity to bluff by betting 200,000. By checking the flop, Kinney got his opponent to commit some chips even though he was drawing dead.

While Kinney made a wise decision on the flop, he followed it up by making a horrendous one on the turn by moving all in. Knopp, who had 848,000 behind, didn't have much of anything and had an easy fold.

Why Kinney didn't just call with his four of a kind is beyond me, and the television commentators agreed.

"Why would he do this with four jacks?" commentator Mike Sexton wondered aloud.

"He might've just lost his fish," co-host Vince Van Patten added.

"Well, he has to lose his fish," Sexton said. "In my view, you must call there with four jacks, the reason being if his opponent had a pair and had a full house, he's gonna bet or call you at the river if you bet, but you must give him a chance to catch a card or to bluff at the river here."

It was a vast overplay and a strategic misstep, but fortunately for Kinney it didn't hurt him in the long run, as he went on to win the tournament for \$629,469.

The man watched the drawing at night and figured the numbers seemed like what he picked out. "I went to the kitchen to grab my ticket, and as I was looking it over, I just kept thinking, 'No way is this happening to me!""

The Cosmo says it was the largest local progressive (as opposed to wide-area, typical in big slot jackpots) in the casino's history.

2) Progressives require a larger bankroll and should always be played at max coin Also look at the starting jackpot values, so you can determine whether the progressive dollar amount is high enough and worth play. If jackpot values are low or near reset value; slot has been hit recently.

3) If your bankroll is limited; rather than play max coin, play ALL lines, but 1-2 coins/line.

4) The best slot payouts are at Las Vegas casinos off the strip and downtown.



My family loves food prepared on an outdoor grill. I live in Florida, so we use our barbecue grill almost all year. Do you have a recipe for grilled shrimp or grilled fish? Thank you. — Anna Mae from Boynton Beach, Florida

Dear Anna Mae,

Here's one of my favorite grilled shrimp recipes. Also, a recipe for grilled salmon too. Enjoy! — **Annie**

ANNIE'S GRILLED SHRIMP AND PINEAPPLES

Sauce:

1 cup water

1/4 cup soy sauce

1/4 cup brown sugar

1 tablespoon honey

1 tablespoon fresh ginger, grated 1 tablespoon fresh garlic, grated

Combine all the ingredients for the sauce in a medium-sized saucepan. Bring to a boil, stir constantly, then simmer for 10 minutes.

2 pounds extra-large or jumbo shrimp, peeled and deveined 1 fresh pineapple, cored and cubed Thread the shrimp and pineapple cubes on 8 skewers. Grill on a hot outdoor barbecue grill or a griddle that is sprayed with PAM or olive oil. Cook for 3-4 minutes per side. Lower the heat and then baste both sides of the skewers. Serves 8.

GRILLED SALMON

Sauce:

1 cup water

1/4 cup soy sauce 1/4 cup brown sugar

1 tablespoon honey

1 tablespoon fresh ginger, grated


1 tablespoon fresh garlic, grated

Combine all the ingredients for the sauce in a medium-sized saucepan. Bring to a boil, stir constantly, then simmer for 10 minutes.

2-3 pounds salmon cut into fillets, do not remove the bottom skin

Marinate the salmon in the sauce for at least 30 minutes. Grill on a hot outdoor barbecue grill or a griddle that is sprayed with PAM or olive oil. Grill the salmon with the skin side down over direct high heat with the lid closed, for about 6-8 minutes or until the fish lightens in color, becomes firmer to the touch and you can lift the fillets off the cooking grates without them sticking. Turn the salmon over, close the lid, and cook for about 2-4 minutes for medium rare or longer to desired doneness. Transfer to a platter to rest for 1-2 minutes. Slide the salmon skin from the fillets prior to serving. Serves 6 to 8.
