

THE TRIUMPH OF ORTHODOXY

Today we commemorate the "Triumph of Orthodoxy," the restoration of the holy icons in the reign of the holy Empress Theodora. On this Sunday in 842 the he resy of Iconoclasm that contradicted the Orthodox Faith was defeated.

From Matins: Verse from Canticle 8 - The honor and veneration we show to the icon we ascribe to the prototype it represents, following the teaching of the saints inspired by God, and with faith we cry aloud to Christ: All works of the Lord, bless the Lord!

FROM THE TRIODION – 2ND WEEK OF GREAT LENT

Monday

Matins (after the 3rd Reading of Psalter): Sessional Hymn - Tone 6

Direct our steps, O Lord, as we set out on the **second week** of the fast. Shine the sanctifying light of your commandments on us and make us worthy to offer you an acceptable prayer on bended knees: for you are Our Father and we are the work of your hands. We sing your praise with fear and call on Your Name!

Tuesday

Vespers - From the Reading: Isaiah 5:7-16 (Verses 15 and 16)

¹⁵ And the mean man shall be brought down, and the mighty man shall be humbled, and the eyes of the lofty shall be humbled: ¹⁶ But the LORD of hosts shall be exalted in judgment, and God that is Holy shall be sanctified in righteousness.

Wednesday

Vespers – Verse from "Lord I call. . . . (Tone 1)

Having undertaken the spiritual fast, brethren, Let us speak no lies with our tongues, Nor give each other a cause for scandal. But illumining the light of our souls through repentance, Let us cry to Christ with tears: Remit our falls in sin, lover of mankind.

Thursday

Matins – An Aposticha Verse (Tone 8)

If we set our hands to doing good, The effort of lent will be a time of repentance for us, A means to eternal life, For nothing quite saves the soul as much as giving to those in need. Alms, inspired by fasting, deliver man from death. Let us embrace this, for it has no equal; It is sufficient to save our souls!

Friday

Vespers – Verse from "Lord I call. . . . (Fone 4)

Now is the acceptable time! Now is the day of salvation! Visit my soul in the abundance of Your Mercy; take away the heavy burden of my transgressions only lover of mankind!

Saturday

Vespers – An Aposticha Verse (Tone 8)

Your tongue, watchful in teaching, rang in the heart, and awakened the souls of men from slothfulness, and by your divinely-sounding word, we find a ladder leading us from earth to heaven. Therefore, Gregory, Wonder Of Thessalonica, never cease entreating Christ to enlighten those who honor you!


