At the last Pension Board meeting the rank escalator calculation was discussed for the old hire pension. The PPA negotiated a 12% pay raise over the next 3 years. This means a 4% raise each January for the next 3 years. They also negotiated an increase in longevity pay and that will also be added to the rank escalator calculation. Since longevity varies for each retiree, Laura Hall will send an explanation of the process to avoid any confusion. This raise will be included in the January benefit payment.

We are committed to making 2023 as eventful as this year. We are always looking for different things to do so if you have any suggestions let us know. We will be going to Laughlin again next year, and encouraging more of you to join us is one of our goals. Again, suggestions welcome.
