The Fruit of The Word

In taking up this subject, we must look at the parable of the sower and the Seed. Matt. 13, Luke 8. We read and hear much of the fruit of the Spirit, but let us remember, before the Spirit can bear fruit the "Word" must first "bring forth," some thirty-fold, some sixty, and some an hundred-

fold. Matt. 13.8.

The Sower goes forth to sow! Matt. 13.3, and the seed that he sows is the "Word of God," (Luke 8.11) and Jesus is the "Word." (John 1.1:14). "In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God-and the Word was made flesh and dwelt among So let us who sow beside all waters, and drop seed on many kinds of soil, be determined as was Paul, "to know nothing save Jesus and Him crucified." (1 Cor. 2.2), and also to "preach not ourselves, but Christ Jesus the Lord; and ourselves your servants for Jesus sake. (2 Cor. 4.5). "Preach the Word." (2 Tim. 4.2).

I believe the first fruit of the Word is Faith, for "faith cometh by hearing, and hearing by the word of God," (Rom. 10.17) and we must have faith before we can even bring forth thirty-fold fruit in our lives." He that cometh to God must believe that He is, and that He is a rewarder of them that diligently seek Him. (Heb. 11.6) Faith is the substance of things hoped for, the evidence of things not seen," (Heb. 11.1) so in coming to God, let us say, first for salvation, we must believe that God hears and answers prayer.

I believe that salvation and justification will cover the thirty-fold fruit in our life. The seed falls on good soil, or on ears that hear and a heart that understands, it brings conviction of sin and leads to repentance. When this happens God sees, forgives, saves and justifies through Christ, the living Word. Acts 13:39. "By Him all that believes are justified," also, "When thou shalt make his soul an offering for sin, he shall see his seed, he shall prolong his days, and the pleasure of the Lord shall prosper in his hand. He shall see

the travail of his soul and shall be satisfied; by his knowledge shall my righteous servant justify many." (Isa. 53.10, 11) "Behold, the Lamb of God which taketh away the sin of the world." (John 1.29) Yes, they behold Him, and He takes away their sin, saves and justifies them. What a pity that so many people are satisfied with just this thirty-fold fruitage, salvation and justification. Why not go on and let the Word bring forth even greater fruit?

It takes patience to do this. Notice Luke 8.15, "hear the word and keep it, and bring forth fruit

with patience.

Coming into the sixty-fold fruitage we come to that place in Christ which He speaks of in John 15. Abiding in Christ, the Vine, we bring forth fruit or bear fruit. Let us look at this as cleansing, sanctification, or holiness, call it what you will, but Jesus said, "Ye are clean through the Word which I have spoken unto you," and being clean we bear fruit, verses 4, 5, 7, 8 of John 15. Glorify God by bringing forth much fruit. Let people know you are Christ's, not by the things we speak, but by the fruit we bear. "Ye shall know them by their fruit." (Matt. 7.16) 'Sanctify them through thy truth, thy word is truth." John 17.17, 19. "Thy Word" here again we see the seed again doing it's faithful work, keeping us above sin. What! You say live above sin?

Yes, in 1st. John 3, John writes, "Now we are the sons of God," v.2, and "whosoever is born of God doth not commit sin; for his seed remaineth in him; and he cannot sin, because he is born of

God.

We see then what the seed will do. David understood what the word would do when he said: "Thy word have I hid in mine heart, that I might not sin against thee. Psa. 119.11." Just get the word of God deep rooted in your heart, then notice how quickly it will come and strengthen you, or warn you when the enemy comes to tempt and try you.

Yes, we do find many people who are bringing forth sixty-fold fruitage, and are really glorifying God, but there still is a place of greater fruit bearing, that is in the hundred-fold fruitage.

I believe that the hundred-fold fruit bearers are they who go on into the overcoming life, and why I believe this is because the greatest promises are to the overcomer, or to those who have come into the unity of the faith, and of the knowledge of the Son of God, unto a perfect man, unto the measure of the stature of the fullness of Christ. Eph. 4.13.

There are three things to overcome, and in just what order to place them we can leave with the individual, but now we will look at them as, (1) The World. 1 John 5.4, 5. Here we see again that whatsoever is born of God overcometh the world, and we see also faith taking it's place, notice how the thirty and sixty fold fruitage can if you are willing, lead us on into an hundred-fold fruitage. 1 John 3.2; "Beloved, now are we the sons of God and it doth not yet appear what we shall be, but we know that when He shall appear, we shall be like Him; for we shall see Him as He is." How do we know? We know because we have gone on to that full stature and have overcome, first the world. Yes, He gave the word, and the world hath hated those that are His because they were not of the world, even as He was not of the world, but praise God, He prayed for us and God can and does keep us. John 17. 14, 15, 16. Overcoming the world even as He overcame, even though in it we have tribulation. (John 16. 33) but it is tribulation that worketh patience, and patience brings forth fruit.

2nd. We see the Spirit of Anti-Christ which John wrote was already in the world in that day. (1 John 4.3) and so much the more so now, but thank God He also says, "Ye are of God, little children, and have overcome them because greater is He that is in you, than he that is in the world."
(1 John 4.4) Who is in us? "Christ in you, the hope of Glory." (Col. 1.27).

3rd. We come to that terrible foe, Satan himself, and the power is given unto us to overcome him also. Now is come salvation

(first) and strength, and the kingdom of our God, and the power of his Christ; for the accuser of our brethren is cast down, which accused them before our God day and night. And they overcame him by the blood of the Lamb and the word of their testimony, and they loved not their lives unto the death. (Rev. 12.10, 11) Our testimony, the Word of God, we rest ourselves safely on its truth and are willing with His grace to defend it with our lives. Yes, we defeat even Satan with the Word, saying, "It is written." (Matt. 4.10.)

What are some of the promises given to the overcomer? We find eight of them recorded in the Book

of the Revelation.

- 1. "To him that overcometh will I give to eat of the tree of life, which is in the midst of the paradise of God. (Rev. 2. 7.)
- 2. "He that overcometh shall not be hurt of the second death." (Rev. 2.11.)
- 3. "To him that overcometh will I give to eat of the hidden manna, and will give him a white stone, and in the stone a new name written, which no man knoweth, saving he that receiveth it." (Rev. 2.17.)
- 4. "He that overcometh, and keepeth My words unto the end, to him will I give power over the nations: and he shall rule them with a rod of iron, as the vessels of a potter shall they be broken to shivers: even as I received of My Father. And I will give him the Bright and Morning Star." (Rev. 2.26, 27, 28.)
- 5. "He that overcometh, the same shall be clothed in white raiment; and I will not blot out his name out of the Book of Life, but I will confess his name before My Father, and before His angels." (Rev. 3.5.)
- 6. "Him that overcometh will I make a pillar in the temple of My God, and he shall go no more out: and I will write upon him the name of My God, and the name of the city of My God, which is new Jerusalem, which cometh down out of heaven from My God: and I will write upon him my new name." (Rev. 3.12.)

- 7. "To him that overcometh will I grant to sit with Me in My throne, even as I also overcame, and am set down with My Father in His throne." (Rev. 3.21.) "And they overcame him by the blood of the Lamb and by the word of their testimony." (Rev. 12.11.)
- 8. "He that overcometh shall inherit all things; and I will be his God, and he shall be my son." (Rev. 21.7.)

Dear ones, don't you feel that it's worth while to go on, and become an hundred-fold fruit-bearing Son of God? Let us wait on God, renewing our strength, hiding His word in our hearts, and striving to enter in for His name's sake. (Rev. 21.7.)

Sitting at His blessed feet like Mary of old, we too, will hear gracious words from the Master, as we choose that good part, and moment by moment stand on His word. Let us treasure the word in our hearts that we may bring forth fruit, some an hundred, some sixty and some thirty-fold.

You might mention these facts, and also that some of the brethren in Judea have been heard to say that if I keep on, in a few years I might have anything in the gift of the church.

For recommendations you can write Rev. S. Peter, D. D.; Jerusalem, Palestine. I will say that I am a first-class mixer, and especially strong in argumentative preaching. If I accept the call I must stipulate for two months vacation and the privilege of taking an occasional lecture tour. My lecture on "Over the Wall in a Basket" is worth two drachmas of any man's money.

MY IMPRESSIONS OF THE BIBLE SCHOOL

It has been my privilege to attend Camp Meetings, Convocations, Evangelistic Meetings as well as Church and Missions. I thought they were all about the best services I ever attended. They were wonderful for the spirit of God was there and mighty work and miracles were done as God permitted.

This is the first time I have ever had the privilege of attending a Bible School. To think it was brought to our city (Wichita); it has always been said that this city was considered a very difficult place to work, but when God undertakes all problems become easy.

Under the leadership of Bro. Albert Durham, Bro. Ben Barker, Bro. Gail Schultz and Sister Pauline Parham and a lot of prayer, Wichita was agreed upon as a suitable place.

Bro. Durham shouldered the reponsibility of securing apartments or rooms for the students and teachers from out of town, which was no small undertaking, for our city is over crowded with defense workers. Some provisions were made for food to cover this four weeks period. Some students came prepared to provide for themselves, others had to be supplied these needs as they were in the gospel work or preparing themselves for the work as they go by faith believing their need will be supplied by God the Father.

The school started off in the Spirit of Unity and continued in that Spirit. We probably did not see eye to eye on all subjects that were discussed, but with the help of the Scriptures and prayer, it is my opinion that most of the subjects discussed were handled to the best advantage and the solution was agreeable to the student body in as much as they knew it was the Word of God.

The one outstanding feature was the interest of the young people in preparing themselves as teachers, Evangelists and Gospel Workers. Their interest was gratifying to one who believes they will be rewarded for their efforts. I believe time to be very short therefore, it is their duty for them

to prepare themselves with great speed knowing their rewards will be the same as others who have opened the way for this Move-

Under Bro. Ben Barker, the teacher of Prophecy, the students were supplied with unlimited amount of information based on the Bible from charts, as well as Bible references on creation and formation, a teaching that has been a part of the Movement and gives the students the fundamental principles on which to build and give answers to several questions that without this knowledge would be hard to answer. A chart giving the different period of time with relation to man was very helpful. How God has a plan and how man fits into the plan, or in some cases did not fit into God's plan, teaches us why it was necessary to take man out of the Garden of Eden, why the flood was sent upon earth, why God sent his Son to save the world, also took up the Gospel age, the Millennial age, the Judgment, the new heaven and new earth.

Bro. Gail Schultz, teacher of Doctrine, gave the students the advantage of his accumulation of knowledge and experiences. Bro. Gail made plain that doctrine is necessary and that there is a true and false doctrine. Some times man made doctrines has been allowed to creep into the churches. By the Spirit we can discern the spirits

He took up different periods of time and peoples giving the different steps of Christian progress and with the different gifts and graces, at all times making it clear to the student there are the true and false. Also took up the ordinances of water baptism, taking communion and feet washing.

Sister Pauline Parham, teacher of Evangelism, certainly covered the subject. It could be said the Spirit of Evangelism is the life of the Church. Sister Parham has the spirit as well as the vision. She sees and teaches the need of a spirit filled Church and leader if we have a healthy Church. Her vision reaches not only to the local church, but as a world-wide Movement. Fulfilling the great commission put upon the followers of Christ to go into all the world to

make disciples in all nations. She teaches this Movement started and should be continued as God's Spirit leads. She looks forward to a time when this Movement will supply missionaries to all parts of the world as God moves upon them to go fitting them for their special work and supplying their needs as they go.

As to a Bible School I think the thought is wonderful, the need is great, but the time is short. If we believe what we teach, my suggestion is a school on wheels so to speak. This Movement reaches to the coasts. Why not have a faculty that could go from one locality to another, this would reach more workers and Evangelists in a shorter time at less expense.

A Soul Won For Christ

While in Houston, Texas, during the Spring of 1940, I experienced what has to me been a very solemn and most interesting experience, even though it carried with it a feeling of very deep sorrow. On certain nights each week, I was allowed to go into one of the large hospitals to visit, pray with, and distribute tracts to the SICK

One night the nurse in the office asked if I would like to go into the ward located at a certain end of one of the floors. She did not reveal to me that it was in this ward that they had those that were rejected, or for some reason or another looked down upon, or cases

they considered hopeless.

Hoping to waste none of my allotted time, I quietly hurried down the hall, and upon entering the large room, my eyes rested on a very pathetic face which showed signs of agony. Yet, beyond that I could see some strange beauty, and my heart ached within me even before the young woman told me her story. I could at once see that what happened in her life

must happen soon.

I dropped to my knees at her bedside and with her pale hand in mine, prayed and plead most earnestly with God in her behalf. When I looked up through my hot, fast-falling tears, she put her other hand gently on mine and held me there, as though holding to her last hope. She, too, wept as she told me how in her early married life she had so faithfully attended church and felt that she had really known God. Later, she said, her husband persuaded her to go with him into the places of sin, and then left her for another, who seemed to please him more.

This, she said, seemed more than she could bear, and she sought pleasure first one place and then another, until at last, when she came to herself and tried to pray, she decided that she had gone too far, and rather than ask forgiveness, she would just "end it all." Here it was that she broke down completely, but by piecing together her words, I learned that she had taken poison, which had eaten her stomach to such an extent that they had given her only a very short time to live.

Then her wet blue eyes looked at me as though with a ray of light within them, as she said, "Do you think Jesus might forgive I talked with her for some time, still on my knees at her side, until she said, "Please pray for me. I don't want to die alone.

Many were the tears we shed together at that little prayer meeting, and after quite some time, she put her hand on my head and said,

It's alright now.

Never shall I be able to express just how I felt as those words fell on my ears, and then with tears for joy I arose from my knees and sat at her side, my hand and hers still clasped, as we talked about Jesus a

few more minutes.

All too soon for me, the bell rang and I knew I must leave. As I started to go I promised I'll still pray for her, and as she kissed my hand her tears streamed forth. It was indeed a sad parting, as she said, "I'm so glad you came. They (the other patients in the ward) told me no one ever came in here to visit." Reluctantly I let go her hand and said, "Keep loving Jesus. He'll stay by your side," and quietly left the room.

As I passed through the office, my throat was so tight I could not even speak to the nurse, but somehow I think she understood.

You may be sure I went immediately to that same ward on my next visit to the hospital. Through the absence, she had been continually upon my heart. stepped inside and looked toward her bed—now an empty bed—and again the tears rushed down my cheeks. The patient at my other side said, "She's gone."

"Bondage or Liberty"

Exodus 2; 23, Israel cried unto the Lord and their cry came up unto God by reason of the bondage. They had been experiencing many hardships and struggles. Indeed, they were in bondage, but they took the proper steps for de-liverance. They cried unto the Lord. Praise His name. He is still on high and He still hears the cries of His people. Many people and conditions are changed in answer to prayer of God's people. It does not say they just said prayers, but they cried out unto the Lord and got wonderful results. Listen to Ex. 6; 6, "Wherefore say unto the children of Israel, I am the Lord, and I will bring you out from under the burden of the Egyptians, and I will rid you out of their bondage, I will redeem you with a stretched out arm, and with great judg-ments." We know that the children of Israel were miraculously delivered from Pharoah and the Egyptian hordes, but not without the fulfilling of the last words of Ex. 6; 6, with great judgments. Those judgments fell upon the Egyptians even to the extent of death that swept over the land. And this did not stop the enemy from pursuing at their heels. It seemed as though they would be defeated and similar circumstances have been experienced by nations standing for the right but God, in His goodness and mercy has allowed a red sea or its equivalent to put a stop to the enemy. A lasting liberty for mankind must come from-God and this liberty is promised on a larger and-greater scale for the saved of the earth. Humanity has never experienced such liberty as is described in the great plan of God for the redeemed of the Lord. This is made possible by something else that is red. I mean the precious, red blood of our Lord and Master that was shed for the remission of sin. For as in Heb. 9; 22, says without the shedding of blood there is no remission of sin. I Peter 1; 18, 19, says that we are not redeemed with corruptible things, as silver and gold, but with the precious blood of Jesus Christ as a lamb without blemish and without spot. I had quite a talk with him and asked what he had done to stop drinking. He said, "I have gone some distance from it so that I could not get it and I would crave it so that I would almost go mad. My mother and wife have begged and pleaded with me to leave it alone. I promised and promised, only to go back to it again." He said, "My father has a very high position with the government. He has offered me a thousand dollars twice if I would stop drinking. I tried and failed." He went on to say, "I am asking you as a minister of the gospel, what can I do?" I asked, "Do you believe in Jesus Christ?" He said, "yes." I said, "are you willing to repent and surrender your-self to Him?" He said, "yes." We both got on our knees and prayed together about thirty minutes and liberty came to that man through the Lord Jesus Christ. There was a change at once. His countenance was changed, his nerves were calmed. He gave his testimony of what Christ had done for him. O brother, the Saviour can change the vilest sinner when he or she meets the conditions. Yes, friends, there is liberty in the Saviour of men. We recall what our Lord says in Isaiah 61; 1, "To proclaim liberty to the captive." Many in the world are in tive." ment, "Thou shalt not take the name of the Lord thy God in vain?" It is indeed very shocking the way many use God's name with so little reverence. The word reverend is recorded in Psalm, and it says, Holy and Reverend is His Name. So many men and women are in bondage to sin, they use the name of God as though it is just a word for slang. May people awaken to this terrible injustice to the holy name of man's best friend, Christ Jesus. Those who take His name in vain will be found guilty according to the words of the third commandment. There is liberty from this ungodly, senseless habit by this same Christ who saves from all other sins. Again we wonder how many are in bondage in relative to the 7th commandment, "Thou shalt not commit adultery?" According to the teaching of our Lord, the breaking of this commandment would be very wide spread over the earth in the closing days of time. It is one of the signs of the times. I am sure none can dispute this statement of God's word. Those who are intellectually insane are to be pitied. But moral insanity is an abomination to God, and is unspeakably disgraceful. No wonder that our Lord says of some in relative to the resurrection who died in their sins, "Some shall arise to shame and everlasting destruction." Folks are good at finding excuses when they are not serving the Lord, and some like to pick at the Bible, especially when they are in some bondage of sin. That reminds me of some people that fight the Baptism of the Holy Ghost. They like the message of salvation and others like the message of sanctification, but when it comes to the Baptism of the Holy Spirit with the evidence of speaking in other languages as the Spirit gives utterance, they say it is of the devil. Let us be careful what we say about the Word of God. Search the scriptures very prayerfully. Don't be in bondage, regardless what might confront you take your liberty in the Lord. Praise Him for evermore. thing to do is to stop criticizing the Bible and those who are serving the Lord and become interested in your own state of affairs. The fact is we do not have a leg to

stand on when we are opposing the Word of God. It is really wonderful to be out of the land of bondage, spiritually speaking, and to be a disciple of the Lord Jesus. The greatest thing that can come to pass in one's life is to be born of the Spirit of our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ. "He whom the Son of man sets free is free indeed," sayeth the scripture. Liberty and freedom are obtainable through Christ now. Many are, as it were, in the fiery furnace like the three Hebrew children who were captive of the enemy. Ah, but they were not alone. The Son of God delivered them and the same Christ shall deliver you from your fiery trials. Some of you may be in captivity to sickness, but the promise is, "And with His stripes we are healed," Isa. 53; 5. Then many of us have loved ones whose bodies are dead or held in captivity by death. Such was the case of The weeping sisters Lazarus. asked the Lord for help. Jesus gave them help when He said, Lazarus, come forth," and he came forth from the dead. This is an example of what Christ said He would do as recorded in the 5th chapter of John when He said, "All that are in the graves shall hear His voice." Thank God for the liberty that shall come by His command. We are exhorted in Gal. 5; 1, to stand fast in the liberty wherewith Christ has made us free, and be not entangled again with the yoke of bondage. Many gallons of blood has been spilt for liberty and freedom for nations, but Christ gave His blood to deliver us from the bondage of sin. It is up to each one of us as to whether we want to be in sin, bondage or to be free through the Liberator, Christ Jesus. If any of you have left the Father's house of obedience and are away from home, so as to speak, the only remedy for you, my friend, is to go back to God through Christ and in so doing you will leave the life of bondage you are in now, and once again you will enjoy the liberty and freedom that our Lord can give. What is your choice, bondage or liberty? It is up to us. If we want lasting liberty then we must have Christ, the Greatest of all liberators.
