

The Town of New Tecumseth is closing the gap in the Trans Canada Trail between the Town of Innisfil and Town of Caledon. The Town has approximately 26 km of abandoned rail line that will be the route of the New Tecumseth portion of the Trans Canada Trail.

Pending adequate funding, the construction of the Trans Canada Trail through New Tecumseth will be constructed in 3 to 4 phases. The project started in 2012, with an expected completion date of 2015-16.

The trail will be open to walkers, cyclists, equestrians, cross country skiers, snow-shoers, naturalists and to snowmobilers, north of the 14<sup>th</sup> Line. Most sections will be accessible to all users regardless of physical ability impairments. The nature of the trail and the numerous road sections make the trail an excellent venue for residents and tourists alike to customize their trail outing to their own needs with respect to distance and destination.
