Town of Stratton Selectman's Meeting

April 22, 2024

Present: Selectman: Chair – Al Dupell, Chris Liller, Greg Marcucci, and Boomer Walker.

7:30 pm: Al Dupell called the meeting to order. Orders were reviewed and signed. No modifications were made.

Road Crew Issues: Generator Replacement: Powers has repaired the generator. Chris Liller is still collecting quotes for its replacement. Line-Striping: The Selectmen accepted a quote from Green Mountain Line-Striping of \$3400.00 to paint ⁶/₁₀th of a mile of yellow and white lines and three crosswalks on Stratton Mountain Access Rd., through the resort. Also, \$1300.00 to paint lines and handicapped parking markings at the Town Office. Boomer Walker so moved. Greg Marcucci seconded – all concurred. Propane: The Board accepted an estimate from Guy Nido for propane at the Town Office / Town Hall and the Town Garage. Nido estimated \$1.80 to \$1.95 / gallon, dependent on the summer contract price he gets. Beginning in January, 2025, an additional tax may be added to this amount dependent on the State of Vermont's Clean Heat Standard legislation. Tanks and service will be switched over soon. Grants-In-Aid: With the consent of the board, Al Dupell signed a letter of intent to participate in this program during fiscal year 2025. Chris Liller will forward the letter to VTrans. The board also consented to submit a formal request to the Windham Regional Commission (WRC) for Supportive Work (Technical Assistance) for the Grants-In-Aid Program. Al Dupell signed the letter and Chris Liller will forward it to WRC.

Green Mountain Power Mountain Rd. Project: A representative was unable to attend this meeting, but intends to be present at the May 13 meeting.

Town Hall Rentals: The Selectmen approved to allow Allison Young use of the Town Hall on May 4, 2024 (Jared LaMarche, previously approved for that date canceled his reservation).

Minutes: The Selectmen approved the Selectman's and Liquor Control Board minutes of April 8, 2024.
