First Class rank requirements 6a, 6b, and 6e: (6a) Successfully complete the BSA swimmer test.

- (6b) Tell what precautions must be taken for a safe trip afloat.
- (6e) With a helper and a practice victim, show a line rescue both as tender and as rescuer. (The practice victim should be approximately 30 feet from shore in deep water.)

Scouts should keep in mind that the requirements include: 1b. Swim continuously for 400 yards using each of the following strokes in a strong manner for at least 50 continuous yards: front crawl, sidestroke, breaststroke, and elementary backstroke.

The 400 yard swim must be performed prior to moving on to any subsequent requirements. Scouts should come to class prepared to present front crawl, sidestroke, breaststroke, and elementary backstroke in a strong manner.

SPEND TIME PRACTICING.
