Pastor's Corner

Let me begin with a quote by A.W. Tozer: “We may as well face it: the whole level of spirituality among us is low. We have measured ourselves by ourselves until the incentive to seek the higher things of the Spirit is all but gone. We have imitated the world, sought popular favor, manufactured delights to substitute for the joy of the Lord and produced a cheap and synthetic power to substitute for the power of the Holy Ghost. The glowworm has taken the place of the bush that burned and scintillating personalities now answer to the fire that fell at Pentecost.” (*Of God and Men*)

I recently read my brother Chris's article in his recent newsletter, and I thought, “Hey! That goes perfectly with the series we've been doing at Puckety on Acts!” His article was titled, “*I've Got Jesus. Why Do I Need the Holy Spirit?*” Bracing himself for the inevitable drop in fervor after Pentecost Sunday, he asks, “Why is it that so many churches tend to highlight the person and work of the Holy Spirit on this day, but not so much any other day?” I feel the same way (and not just because we're twins). In his book, *Forgotten God: Reversing Our Tragic Neglect of the Holy Spirit*, Francis Chan has this to say: “While no Christian within orthodox belief would deny the Holy Spirit's existence, I'm willing to bet there are millions of churchgoers across America who cannot

confidently say they have experienced His presence or action in their lives over the past year. And many of them do not believe they can. Perhaps we're too familiar and comfortable with the current state of the church to feel the weight of the problem. But what if you grew up on a deserted island with nothing but the Bible to read? Imagine being rescued after 20 years and then attending a typical church. Chances are you'd be shocked. Having read the Scriptures, you would be convinced that the Holy Spirit is as essential to a believer's existence as air is to staying alive. You would know that the Spirit led the first Christians to do unexplainable things, to live lives that didn't make sense to the culture around them, and ultimately to spread the story of God's grace around the world. There is a gap between what we read in Scripture about the Spirit and how many Christians operate today. I believe that this missing something is actually a missing Someone—namely, the Holy Spirit. Without Him, people operate in their own strength and only accomplish human-size results. The world is not moved by love or actions that are of our own making. And the Church is not empowered to live differently from any other gathering of people without the Holy Spirit. But when believers live in the power of the Spirit, the evidence in their lives is supernatural. The Church cannot help but be different, and the world cannot help but notice.” The Holy Spirit is absolutely vital to the life of the Church today. After all, if the Holy Spirit moves, nothing can stop Him (*remember what Gamaliel said at the start of the series? – if you missed any of the messages, simple go to our Facebook page and scroll down and find the service in question*). If the Spirit doesn't move, we will shrink back from our testimony (*remember Stephen?*) If He doesn't move, we will not produce genuine fruit (*remember Tabitha?*). The church becomes irrelevant when it becomes purely a human entity (John 15). That sounds harsh, but we need to hear it. We are not all we were made to be when everything in our lives can be explained apart from the work and presence of the Spirit of God. The Spirit is evident in places where people are desperate for Him, humbled before Him, and not distracted by the pursuit of worldly comforts (ever before us).

I pray we will go beyond our current understanding of the Holy Spirit ... that our experience with Him

would be day by day, even moment by moment. That by keeping in step with the Spirit, we might regularly share what He's doing rather than what He did months or years ago. May we be reminded of the strength and wisdom available to us through the Spirit and earnestly pray for more. As we trust in the promises of the Spirit, we will be led away from discouragement and into lives marked by confidence, power in the midst of our weakness, and the fruit of the Spirit. When I read Scripture, I see the truth and necessity of a life wholly surrendered to and dependent upon the Holy Spirit. Are we holding back from giving ourselves completely to Him? I want to see God move through me, through my family, through Puckety, and through the worldwide Body of Christ. May our desire be to experience more of the Holy Spirit. And may we open our hearts and lives to His presence and power more fully than we have ever done before. Thanking God for the Holy Spirit,

It was designed in connection to our Church *Mission Statement* (something we encourage all of our members to memorize as both a tool for prayer and incentive for their personal ministry): "As Puckety Church, we personally and collectively **Honor God** (represented by the uplifted hands in worship), **Grow in Faith** (represented by the tree trunk growing upward – Christ at the center) and **Improve our Community & World** (the branches and leaves that *spread out*, flowing from our rootedness in Christ, bringing life to others)" [section in italics added for explanation]. Though the 3 parts of the logo are meant to represent those aspects specifically, the artwork is fluid enough that each part reinforces the others (e.g., the hands can be seen as "serving hands" that help improve the world ... and the green of the leaves also convey "growth" in faith. Capital Campaign

God is good! Just ask anyone on the planning committee, and they'll fill you in with a smile. 1) We have hit our *halfway mark* (we have raised a little over \$77,400 toward the goal of \$139,500 – it was raised slightly because of a justified parking lot bid increase since we elected an option that will add durability to the corner section). Thank you! Therefore, we are set and ready to start the first project – the parking lot – either the last week of June or the start of July. 2) Our loan application through PILP (*Presbyterian Investment & Loan Program*) was approved. We received a confirmation letter for the \$70,000 at 5.9% (an excellent rate), giving us 5 years to repay but there is no penalty for early payment – a great goal for us to work toward. We will likely have the loan funds by mid-July, which will allow the second project (the roof) to be done in mid to late July, and the third part of the project (the digital sign) in mid-fall (October).

Please continue to give (either in accordance to your pledge) or in your offerings each week/month. Please also take advantage of the 3 fundraising opportunities: 1) purchase gift cards through the *Raise Right* program (we've found that setting up an account and ordering them linked to your bank account is easiest, fastest and incurs the least amount of fees. Also, the security protection offered by PLAID for those transactions is extremely reliable). For more information, please see Denise Wehrle, Deb Artman, Matt Wehrle or Alice Knopfel. 2) This summer we plan on having a Hoagie sale, keep a watch out for it. 3) Finally, we plan to have a Spaghetti Dinner + Basket Raffle on Sat. November 2nd (with the baskets available to display and tix the weekend before at Trunk or Treat). We will need help making these events a success, so we thank you in advance for your support.

A Devotional – please share with a family with a graduate or high school student

I'm sharing this from a colleague (and fellow pilgrim) in ministry, Rev. Jim Farrer.

1) *Never doubt your uniqueness.*



Each person is made in the image of God. Of the billions of individuals on earth, each has a unique fingerprint and voiceprint. Today iris identification technology takes less than one second. Personal DNA demonstrates intricately-designed creations rather than randomly-produced “blobs.” Ephesians 2:10 reassures us: “You are one of God’s masterpieces.” (NLT).

2) *Church is fantastic for you.*

Duke University researcher Harold Koenig, MD has overseen the analysis of peer-reviewed journal studies from 1872 to the present on religion and health, most of it concerning Christianity. His summary of the importance of religious commitment in a religious community follows: “In general, (people) cope with stress better, they experience greater well-being because they have more hope. They’re more optimistic, they experience less depression, less anxiety and they commit suicide less often. They don’t drink alcohol as much, they don’t use drugs as much, they don’t smoke cigarettes as much and they have healthier lifestyles. They have stronger immune systems, lower blood pressure, probably better cardiovascular functioning and probably a healthier hormonal environment physiologically ...and they live longer.” He also concludes: “Lack of religious involvement...is equivalent to 40 years of smoking one pack of cigarettes per day.”

3) *Seek joy over happiness.*

Most people desire to be happy. Professor Martin Seligman at the University of Pennsylvania reports that billionaires and the Amish are equally happy. William Saroyan writes: “The greatest happiness you can have is knowing that you do not necessarily require happiness.” Dr. Victor Frankl who tracked the hopelessness in the Nazi concentration camps discovered that what people want is not to be happy, but rather a reason to be happy. A connected relationship with the Most High God whom we know best through Jesus of Nazareth brings meaning, purpose and a deep-seated joy in the midst of the dark times of life.

4) *Explore How ... Wow ... but also **Why**.*

Science can share facts about “how” things originate, but over time these “facts” tend to change. In schools science is best taught when it leads to the joy of discovery. The telescopes and microscopes should enhance the “Wow!” However, the Bible is the book which really concentrates on the “Wow,” the awe and wonder of the world’s design. Science has little clue about any “who” which caused the universe. Science also does not deal with “why” the universe was made. John 3:16 reads: “God so loved the world = cosmos...” The Greek word here agape means self-giving and long-term covenant love. Find your “why” in the love God has revealed for you. Jim Farrer has served Redstone Presbytery as a consultant in church vitality.
