During the making of the animated Christmas Classic "A Charlie Brown Christmas" Peanuts creator, Charles Schulz had a meeting with Lee Mendelson (Producer) and Bill Melendez (Lead Animator). The discussion concerned Schulz's insistence about including a New Testament scripture reading of the Christmas story from the Bible. The scripture reading was to be spoken by Peanuts Character, Linus Van Pelt in response to Charlie Brown's lament "Isn't there anyone who knows what Christmas is all about?" Mendelson and Melendez both voiced their concern about the reading, with Melendez telling Schulz "It is very dangerous for us to start talking about religion now." Schulz answered him by saying, "Bill, if we don't, who will?" In the end, the scripture reading [Luke 2:8-14 (KJV)] was retained and the CBS Special was the second most watched show of the week when it debuted on December 8, 1965.
