Mankind is incurably religious. What does it mean to be religious today?1. Ch. 2 & 3's question & answer dialogues give us clear insight into what Jesus said & thought about religion and religious observances.

I. THE QUESTION: WHY DON'T YOUR DISCIPLES FAST LIKE THE
DISCIPLES OF JOHN & THE PHARISEES?
A. Nature of fasting.
1, as a religious practice, is clearly taught in OT & NT
2. Old Testament practice: usually abstinence from food, but not water.
a. Law of God requires only one of fasting a year. Day of Atonement: Leviticus 23:23-32. Time for repentance & forgiveness.

b. Fasting was to humble the by the affliction of one's soul based upon belief that such humbling is pleasing in God's sight.

c. Act of fasting does not always please Isaiah 58:3-9a
3. New Testament practice.
a. Pharisees overextended law to where said had to fast 2x per week.
When did, had to paint face white & wear torn clothes so everyone would
know you are fasting. It was religion for ceremony's sake.
b. disciples joined in this practice as symbol of
b disciples joined in this practice as symbol of repentance & desire for Kingdom to come.
c fasted, including 40 days in wilderness at beginning of
his ministry. Paul fasted. So did whole churches in Antioch (Acts 13) &
Galatia (Acts 14).
d. Jesus taught that fasting is appropriate for his followers but was to be
done differently than what was practiced in Judaism. Mt. 6:16-18.
B. Purpose of question is to drive wedge between Jesus & others.
1. Jesus & disciples of John came preaching a gospel
of repentance. With it, one was to afflict one's soul & be baptized so
Kingdom of God might come. Practiced Pharisaical fasting.
2. Jesus & his Jesus' followers did not practice fasting as
Pharisees & disciples of John did.
3. Jesus summed up facts well in Matthew 11:16-19. John & Jesus each
had different ministry. John came preaching Fasting is
right & necessary. Jesus came preaching the Kingdom. Time to
, not fast.

C. Man's understanding of must give way to the
pure & undefiled religion revealed by me, Jesus.
1. Two mini-parables are here. You can't put new cloth on an old garment.
You can't put new wine into old wine-skins. If you try, the original will be
ruined & the new will be wasted.
2. Pharisees perfected making religion boring, burdensome & dismal.
3. For few years after Jesus' resurrection, some in Church thought could
synthesize Judaism & Christianity. Jerusalem Council in Acts 15 de-cided
once for all that Christianity & Judaism were separate & distinct
dispensations of God's grace at work & could not be fit together. What the
law of Moses could never do, the Gospel of brings to
us joy, peace & love that we celebrate with delight.
III. APPLICATION
A does not equate with being Christian.
1. Christian faith is about living in & loving Christ & brethren so that the
Church demonstrates convincingly that the time of celebration has come &
we know how to rejoice & live in mighty, definite joy in Jesus.
2. We are no longer lost. We've been found, redeemed, renewed,
restored, reconciled, regenerated not by keeping any specific ritual but by
the glorious, majestic, transforming grace of God in Jesus Christ
