



## **Apostles Building Update**

We are now fully engaged and very excited about the 2023 Apostles Build at 1023 Jamison Avenue. The homeowner, Aubrey Wood, has been working on her home as have the partnering churches, our recurring volunteers and general volunteers. Attached is a photo of the current progress.

# **Frequently Asked Questions**

Are the Habitat homes given away for free?
Absolutely not. All Habitat homes are sold to the homeowner families who in turn make monthly mortgage payments back to Habitat-Roanoke. The pay-back model is a paramount foundation for all HFH affiliates

# If the family is paying for the Habitat home, why do churches have to make a financial contribution?

While the family is paying, Habitat sells the home to them at below market value and definitely below the cost of building. The sales price is based on the family's income so that monthly mortgage payments will be no more than 30% of the family's monthly income. This is the definition of affordable housing. Contributions from the churches and other funding sources are needed to cover the remaining costs of each home that the mortgage does not cover.

#### How much money needs to be raised for the 2023 Apostles Build?

We are hoping for a collective \$50,000-\$70,000. While this amount will not cover all remaining costs of the home, it will cover a large portion of them.

#### When can churches make payments towards the 2023 Apostles Build?

We ask that all financial gifts made toward the 2023 AB be sent to Habitat-Roanoke by the dedication of this home. We expect dedication to take place in early September so that gives some time. We like to close the books on a project immediately after it becomes the official property of the homeowner. Your financial gifts can be in one lump sum or broken up across as much time as you desire.

#### Do financial gifts from the church have to come from the church budget?

Absolutely not. We want your church to do fundraising however it is best for you. Many churches do gifts strictly from their budget. Some do a hybrid gift with some money coming from the budget and some from other sources like a special offering or a fun fundraiser. Some churches raise money for the Habitat build completely outside of their regular budget. Some ideas have been "Pass the Bucket" for pocket change, a youth or children's bake sale/dinner, musical concerts or a special event that focuses on Habitat or affordable housing issues. Individuals may also make donations directly through the Habitat-Roanoke website. If they put a note stating that their gift should go toward the noted church for the 2023 Apostles Build, it will be credited towards your church gift. We are very open to and excited about outside-of-the-box ideas. Please share yours if you use one.

#### How can families apply for a Habitat home?

Families of any size from one adult to many members can contact the Habitat-Roanoke office at any time to get information about applying for a home. We do accept applications during quarterly open periods, but they can begin work on their application whenever. Qualified candidates must make at least \$1400 in monthly income, must have never previously owned a home, must be in good rental standing and must have a low debt ratio. Families must be willing to attend our homeownership courses and do sweat-equity hours. Our Family Services Director, Joyce Williams, will be happy to discuss specifics with any interested family, and we have informational brochures that we will happily give to your church to pass out to your members that may have this need.
