Gaming Ethics

I was interviewed for a show on casino gambling and the host asked hypothetical questions to average gamblers and gambling experts. Most of the questions they asked me on the show had to do with blackjack and I thought it would be fun if I turned around and asked you how you would handle these situations.

Suppose you are playing blackjack and a sloppy dealer exposes her hole card. What would you do if that happened? Would you tell the dealer? Or would you say nothing and use the information to your advantage when it came time to play out your hand?

Some players feel it is unethical to take advantage of the casino by knowing the value of the dealer's hole card. However, I feel differently and said so.

My position when it comes to sloppy dealers is this. It is not my responsibility to ensure that dealers are following casino procedures. Floor supervisors and surveillance should be on the lookout for dealers who are not following procedures and correct them. Since the information on the dealer's hole card was available to any player on the table, and since I wasn't in cahoots with the dealer in a pre-planned cheating scam, I see no reason why a player can't use the information to his or her advantage.



It turned out an official from the Nevada Gaming Board agreed with my conclusion. A sloppy dealer exposing the hole card is an issue that the casino needs to address and there is nothing illegal about a player taking advantage of the information in this scenario.

The host of the show fired this next question to me. “If you know the value of the hole card because of a sloppy dealer, would you share this information with one of your fellow players?”

Several people that they interviewed on the show had mixed feelings about this. Some felt it was okay to use the information for their own benefit, but thought it was unethical to share that information with fellow players.

I felt otherwise. Blackjack is

a social game; players often talk with each other. If I had a friend or family member playing on the same table, I wouldn't be averse to offering them advice on how they should play their hand based on what I knew was the dealer's hole card. You may not agree 100% with my response, but that is how I see it.

Another question the host asked me had to do with a cheating dealer. “What if you were playing blackjack and you have a strong suspicion that a fellow player and your dealer were involved in a cheating scam to bilk the casino? What would you do? Would you ignore the situation and just keep playing? Would you leave the table and discreetly inform a floor supervisor of the alleged cheating that you believe was going on?”

My response was to get off the table, and fast. The reason is that if the casino bosses discovered that the dealer was cheating, because you were playing on the table at the time the cheating occurred you could also have been implicated or at least held for questioning.

Plus, if the dealer was that good at cheating what's to say the dealer wasn't going to cheat you? I don't remember what my response was regarding notifying a supervisor of the alleged cheating, but that's a tough call. I could go either way on this and I guess even now I'm undecided whether I'd go out of my way and notify a supervisor or just leave. What would you do?

Gaming News

Say Goodbye

The Las Vegas Review-Journal reports that Station Casinos is planning to raze its three casinos that have been closed since March 2020, then sell the acreage. Texas Station, Fiesta Rancho, and Fiesta Henderson shut down at the beginning of the pandemic and never reopened; the proceeds from the sale of nearly 110 total acres will be reinvested in new casinos, one large and several small, in North Las Vegas, along with a major new casino at Inspirada in southwestern Henderson and upgrades for Sunset Station and Green Valley Ranch.

Russians Bet on Fake Games

A story on GamblingInsider.com reports that a few weeks after the end of the cricket season of the popular Premier League in India, four imaginative Indians established a cricket “league” to bilk gamblers. The players were mostly unemployed workers, teenagers, and farmers who followed instructions from “umpires” at the behest of the bookies. The matches were streamed on YouTube, but with a narrow camera angle that allowed the bookies to pipe in the noise of a large crowd. Bets were accepted through the Telegram app from three cities in Russia, including Moscow. Nine games were staged before police, tipped off to the scam, arrested the four organizers, seized cricket kits, cameras, and speakers, and shut down the operation.

New York Leads

The first six months of sports betting in New York have generated more tax revenue than any other state has in several years. Between January 8, when mobile sports betting launched in the Empire State, and July 8, \$302 million in taxes had been raised. By comparison, between November 2018 and May 2022, Pennsylvania collected \$265 million in taxes, while New Jersey generated \$237 million from June 2018 to May. It is, however, apples to oranges, considering that New York imposes a hefty 51% tax on profits, while Pennsylvania collects 36% and New Jersey a mere 3%. (In Nevada, it's 6.75%.) New York will earn even more, now that the ninth and last operator, Bally Bet, started booking wagers mid-summer.

All Star Bingo in LA

For many players, the All-Star break in Los Angeles is an opportunity to kick back and relax. For Justin Turner, All-Star Week 2022 has provided several opportunities to make a difference. The Dodgers’ third baseman and his wife, Kourtney, have long been active in the Los Angeles area through their nonprofit, the Justin Turner Foundation. With the All-Star Game happening in Justin’s hometown—both where he grew up and where he plays—the Turners saw the unique platform available and decided to take advantage. Recently they were on hand for the reopening of the Volunteers of America Transition House in downtown Los Angeles, a project the Foundation played a major role in funding and supporting. They kept it going with celebrity Bingo at the Capitol One All-Star Oceanfront at the Santa Monica Pier, a sold-out event benefiting the Justin Turner Foundation. Celebrity Bingo callers included Patrick Renna, Marty York and Victor DiMattia from The Sandlot, Justin Hartley of NBC’s This Is Us and several former and current athletes, such as Andre Ethier, Byron Scott, Gavin Lux and 2022 All-Star Tony Gonsolin. Extreme Bingo

Hi Guy,

Do you have an opinion on the correct number of 9-ons a person should play? I never buy more than two and really prefer to play only one, but I see lots of players play four and six sheets per session, which seems extreme to me. How do they keep up? I would be so afraid I was missing numbers. At the same time, these people who play extra packs must have a better chance of winning. — **Jay, via email**

Hi Jay,

There is really no “correct number” of packs to play. It’s all a matter of how many you can handle comfortably.

I remember my early days of Bingo playing when I felt I needed to play extra packs to stay competitive, and ended up totally stressed out trying to keep up with the caller.



Q: Recently, a new neighbor with a big dog moved into one of the apartments next door. Since then, every morning there’s a fresh deposit of dog poo on my front lawn. Because it happens before sunrise each day, I suspect the new neighbor is letting their dog out, unleashed and unsupervised, to do its business wherever it pleases. How should I deal with this problem? — *Disgusted in Dallas*

A: Owners need to be responsible for their pets, and be good neighbors by keeping their dogs on a leash and picking up after them.

There are a couple of ways to discover the culprit. The low-cost way is to wake up well before dawn and watch your front lawn. Snap a photo of the dog when it comes onto your property. The high-cost way is to install a security camera with a motion sensor. Aim it so that it has a good view of your property but not other yards (it’s a privacy issue). Set it to record when the motion sensor is triggered.

Contact the property manager of the apartment building. Calmly explain the situation and your suspicions, and ask them to remind residents in writing about leash laws. Most property managers will cooperate to solve the problem.

One time two ladies sitting near me offered to help mark my cards, which told me I must have looked so frantic that complete strangers felt they needed to step in and rescue me. Funny now. Totally embarrassing then.

To this day, like you, I am astonished watching players who can cover half a table with Bingo paper and have no problem keeping up with the caller. It’s all about the magic of hand-eye coordination: some folks are superstars at it, others are not.

Luckily, technology has caught up with we slow pokes. If you want to play more cards than you can physically manage, go to a Bingo hall with handheld Bingo devices. You can buy dozens of cards (if your wallet can handle it) and the machine does the tracking for you.

If you find you miss the thump-thump-thump of dauber on paper, buy one or two paper packs to play manually and make the rest electronic. That way you have the best of both worlds, with no strangers pitying you for your lackluster daubing skills. — **Guy**

Doing It on Your Own

The headline of this column could actually be “What to do when your local veterans group doesn’t step up to help other veterans.” Because, yeah, it happens.

Mostly it’s for compelling reasons — the members might be older. For the Veterans of Foreign Wars, it was early 70s. I believe it. Or post membership might have dwindled to the point where there are many on the roster but only a few who actually show up for meetings. But if you’re faced with this situation and you want to focus on helping other veterans, there are a few things you can do on your own or with some likeminded buddies.

If your veterans group is willing to part with money to help other veterans, take the cash. Make suggestions and get their votes on how it should be spent.

Start with Voluntary Services at the local Veterans Affairs medical center. They can always

use donations of money and time. In one calendar year, volunteers toted up 2.6 million hours. Parking lot shuttle driver, office assistant, dining room companion, mail delivery to wards, transportation van driver ... the possibilities are many.

Even outside the VA world, you have options to help needy veterans and their families. You can do grocery shopping for elderly or infirm veterans, mow lawns, corral skilled carpenters and tradesmen to do home repairs, do taxes if you’re a CPA and even match companies with unemployed veterans.

Make inquiries at homeless shelters that serve a lot of veterans and ask what help you can provide. It might be as simple as washing dishes. It might be delivering cases of food from their supplier. You might be playing checkers after lunch or handing out dry socks.

Whatever you do, however small, to help another veteran, can make a difference. You don’t need to be part of a group to do it.

Getting Road-Trip Ready

Here’s something you should know the next time you’re getting your vehicle ready for a road trip. While you may take steps to prepare for a trip—checking tire pressure and oil levels and filling the tank—there is one step that’s often overlooked: checking your vehicle for open safety recalls.

There are millions of unrecalled recalls on U.S. roads today. For example, tens of millions of vehicles in the United States—across all makes and models—have unrecalled, recalled airbags. Even in a minor crash, recalled airbags that deploy can rupture and spray shrapnel into the vehicle—transforming lifesaving devices into life-threatening ones.

That’s why it’s critical that you check your vehicle for recalled airbags and get them repaired at

an authorized dealer. You can find out if your vehicle has an open recall by visiting [CheckToProtect.org](https://www.safercar.gov) and entering your license plate number or Vehicle Identification Number (VIN). The 17-character VIN is located on the driver’s side dashboard near the windshield and can be found on insurance and registration documents.

Repairs are paid by your vehicle manufacturer. Airbag repairs can take as little as one hour and dealers make the process as easy as possible for drivers.





Now here's a tip!

- Got lots of fresh herbs from your summer garden? Hang bunches upside down in a cool place for a week or so. Crumble the leaves into small jars. You've made your own dried herbs.
- "Want super-crunchy fries at home? Soak potato pieces in very cold water for an hour (fridge is best, or add ice often); dry and fry. Drain fries well, dust LIGHTLY with flour and quick-fry one more time for only a minute or so." — **T.C. in Idaho**
- If you want to cool your canned drinks quickly, add water to the cooler with a lot of ice, submerge all drinks under the ice line, and wait about 20 minutes. Without the water, it takes much longer. The water extends the surface contact of the ice.
- To keep your ladder from sinking into soft sand or dirt, put each leg into a can or bucket. It creates a much larger surface area, thereby stabilizing the legs.
- If you run out of bleach, add 4 tablespoons of hydrogen peroxide to a small load of white laundry.



Poker Talk



What Should You Do When There’s a Straight Flush on the Board?

Poker is a complex game. Most of the time it’s filled with common scenarios that require little else than straight-forward thinking. However, every now and then a truly perplexing scenario will arise. That’s exactly what happened down in Texas in the 2022 The Lodge Championship Series \$3,000 Main Event. Early on Day 1d, it was Level 3 (200/300/300) when Matthew Wantman and Philip Shing saw a flop of 4h-5h-6h. The former bet 2,000 from the under-the-gun position and Shing, who was in the cutoff (the spot to the right of the dealer button) just called to see the 7h on the turn. That put four to a straight flush on the board, but even so both players checked. Amazingly, the 3h completed the board on the river to put a rare straight flush on the board. The only way one player could win was if they had the 8h in their hand, which would give them the bigger straight flush. If not,

then the hand would be chopped, provided neither player folded. Wantman was first to act and he bet out a hefty 17,000, which no doubt appeared suspicious to Shing. It was a great spot for Wantman to bet big. He had raised first to act preflop, which indicated he had a strong hand, so Shing’s preflop call suggested he too had a strong hand. That being the case, there were few hands in Shing’s preflop calling range that included the 8h. Knowing that, Wantman didn’t have much to be afraid of if he was in fact bluffing. If Wantman was bluffing, maybe Shing would fold, though there was probably a small chance of that happening given there was a straight flush on the board. Along those lines, if Wantman did actually have it, there was a good chance he was going to get called, so why not bet big? Indeed, Shing wasted little time in making the call with the Ah-Kh for a flopped flush that was rendered moot, and unfortunately for him, Wantman rolled over the 8h-8s for the bigger straight flush. Shing lost the pot and was left shaking his head at what turned out to be a bad beat. You see, on the flop, his ace-high flush was a 92.63% favorite to win. Wantman had to catch either the 7h or running cards to make a full house in order to win, something that would happen just 7.27% of the time. While Wantman won that hand and Shing took a big hit, their ultimate fates in the tournament did not turn out as you might expect. Wantman failed to finish in the money while Shing went on to take 60th place for a \$7,000 payday.

- “WEEPING SALAD”
1 head lettuce
mayonnaise
1 sweet Bermuda onion, sliced
paper thin
sugar
1 carton frozen peas, cooked
Swiss cheese, thin strips
Crumbled bacon

In a large salad bowl, place a layer of lettuce broken into small chunks. Spread several spoonfuls of mayonnaise over it. Add a

layer of paper-thin onion slices; sprinkle lightly with sugar. Add a layer of peas, and a layer of Swiss cheese, cut into strips. Repeat the layers until the bowl is full. Do not toss. Refrigerate the salad for two hours. The sugar will cause the onions to weep, and this with the mayonnaise, makes the dressing. When ready to serve, cover the salad with the crumbled bacon. Serves 6 to 8.

5 ripe avocados
3 small diced tomatoes
2 red onions, finely diced
½ teaspoon chopped fresh coriander
juice of 3 lemons
salt to taste
½ hot pepper, minced


Peel the avocados and chop fine. Add the tomatoes, onions and coriander. Mix well. Sprinkle with the lemon juice. Add the salt and hot pepper. Serve on lettuce, if desired. Serves 8 to 10.


