

I get nothing out of it because I have to constantly care for my kid."

I want you - mothers and/or fathers - to know just how encouraging you are to so many. The elderly woman who often feels



alone beams with a smile at the sight of you wrestling with your little one. She's been there before. She knows how hard it can be, but she smiles because to hear that brings back precious memories. ... The older man who always seems to be grouchy notices you too. He's always talking about how children in this day have no respect or sense of goodness. But he sees you - a young family - in church every week. Like clockwork, he can depend on the sight of you and your young family. You give him hope that maybe the Church isn't doomed after all, because there are still young parents who love God enough to bring their restless children to church.

Bring your children to church! If we don't hear crying, the church is dying. As hard as it might be for you as a parent who's half-asleep, keep on doing what you're doing. You are an encouragement, and you're starting off your children's lives as you should.

<u>St Vincents CCW's</u> helped the Salt Lake Deanery host a "Morning with Mary" retreat by Monsignor Winterer. It was a wonderful reflection on Mary and well attended. From the number of questions that were asked, I am sure the ladies all enjoyed it. I want to thank Pam Grant for offering the use of the Benvegnu Center and making coffee for us. In addition to hosting the Morning with Mary, St Vincents changed their monthly Zoom meetings to their first in-person meeting in April. At each of their meetings they are studying the Papal Encyclical Fratelli Tutti. A few of their members attended the LDT Training hosted by the Salt Lake Deanery in April. They now have a monthly Newsletter, created by their Vice President, for all of the CCW members. They also regularly support the Murray Children's Pantry with food and money.

<u>St Olafs Parish CCW</u> is also quite active with monthly meetings via Zoom, as well as weekly emails to members to share the bulletins, promote on-line Mass, and spiritual resources. A number of their members participated in the LTD Training workshop that the Salt Lake Deanery hosted in April. <u>The Catholic Women's League</u> is still not meeting but they have decided to begin the First Friday Masses again.


