

True and Not True

Guess the words defined by clues. The answers vary in length from 3 to 9 letters long and include 3 capitalized words, 1 foreign word and 1 acronym. The clue punctuation may or may not help you.

Enter the answers in the grid one after the other starting in the top left corner and in the same order as the clues. Across words that don't end in the rightmost square of a row will continue in the first square of the next row. Similarly, down words that do not end in the bottom square will continue in the top square of the next column. 7 across words and 7 down words won't fit into the grid unless one of their letters is removed. These 14 letters taken in order as they appear in the across and then the down answers will spell out the title for the statement in the unclued mystery entry.

The removed letters (shown in red font and bracketed below) will spell:
