## Digital Media at School - 2017 Findings




## The number of surveys returned

- Data entries less than ½ complete removed







F – Food and Nutrition PE – Physical Education CA – Creative Arts A – Administration (form)


L – Languages E – English

Qualitative answers coded as follows in each section per student:

- up to 30 mins => 0 hours
- 31 90 minutes => 1 hour
- 91 150 minutes => 2 hours etc









The following comments are excerpts from surveys.
Students were invited to comment on use of digital media ...

... in the Classroom

'The digital media use in the classroom changes daily'

'Used phone to take a photo of some notes'

'For some quarters there was only one or two people on that device'

'barely verbally interact we always use technology this shouldn't be the case I don't learn that way'

'I like computers but sometimes there is to much'

'The whiteboard is ALWAYS ON and I have to sit up the front'

Top accomodations for students with light sensitivity/migraine when working with digital media...

... at school

- Sitting next to the window/using natural light
- Low luminance screen

Top accomodation for students with light sensitivity/migraine when working with digital media...

... at home

- Taking frequent breaks
- Sitting next to the window /using natural light

Data to come: Teacher perspective and 2018 student and parent data.

Parents of students with light sensitivity/migraine were invited to comment on use of digital media and accommodations...

... at school

'Teachers do not understand and are not willing to take students seriously'

'Teachers don't care they say that's where you need to sit'

'Nothing other than a seating plan where student sits at the front of the class but this is not always going to be the best for every classroom in the school'

'Prefers to read from a book'

'Prefers to sit near a window, not always possible in the classroom'

Parents of **students with light sensitivity/migraine** were invited to comment on use of digital media and accommodations...

... at home

'Prefers window light, the flickering overhead lights are distracting'

'Lighting and printouts of homework'
