Transportation

Centrally located between Portland, Spokane, Boise, Salt Lake City, and Seattle, the City of Pendleton offers the following transportation options:

Road

Redundant, Paved I-84 Access (Portland to Boise to Salt Lake City)

55-mph, "at grade" I-84 Access

Intersection of I-84 and Hwy 11, serving Walla Walla, Washington

Intersection of I-84 and Hwy 395, serving Hermiston, Oregon

Close to intersection of I-82, accessing Tri-Cities and Seattle, Washington

Rail

Served by Union Pacific Railroad (largest railroad network in the US)

UP operates 31,900 miles of track in 23 U.S. states

Main line: Portland to Chicago

Close to Hinkle Locomotive and Repair Facility (largest west of Mississippi River)

River

Port of Umatilla (34 miles)

- Three Terminals

- Containerized and Bulk Cargo

- Premier Container-on-Barge Dock

Port of Morrow (45.3 miles)

- Second Largest Port in Oregon

- Tidewater Terminal (largest terminal upriver from Portland)

- Container-on-Barge Dock (within 24 of ocean-going vessels in Portland)

Air

Eastern Oregon Regional Airport (3 miles from Pendleton city center)

Largest Commercial Airport East of Portland (up to Boeing 757)

Three Runways: 6,300 foot primary; 5,581 foot crosswind; 2,800 foot (UAS only)

Commercial Air Service: Boutique Air (3 flights/day; 7 days/week)

Extensive Taxiways and Apron System; T-Hangars and 200 Tie Downs

Large Terminal Building; Free On-site Parking; Leasable Office Space

Airport Encompasses 2, 273 acres

Adjacent Industrial Park: 750 acres leasable; 525 saleable

Terrain: Primarily Rolling Wheat Fields *Conditions:* 300 VFR Days/Year
