In the Gospel Reading of last Sunday; Mark 6: 7-13 we heard Jesus listening to the twelve apostles Jesus had sent to preach Repentance and, in his name, cast out demons and to heal and cure all sorts of ailments. The disciples sharing their pastoral experience with Jesus and their fellow disciples, were amazed by the divine power Jesus had given them over demons and illnesses.
