## Gaming News

ATLANTIC CITY. Casinowatchers in Atlantic City, NJ, says that in the weeks since the Trump Taj Mahal closed its doors, the seven remaining casinos in that city have not benefited by the drop in competition. As a matter of fact, according to published reports, the numbers dropped by three-and-a-half percent in the month after the closing. The best performer of the seven remaining major casinos was the Tropicana Casino and Resort Atlantic City; it posted a $12.1 \%$ increase in year-on-year figures.

ENGLAND. While many American Bingo halls have either shut down or are decreasing their hours, Bingo is going great guns in England. The BBC is even reporting that not only are the numbers up, but more and more younger people are playing the game.

Having younger people attend games is something that many U.S. Bingo halls have longed for. Some halls, though, have been fighting for younger players. At least one hall in Nevada announced youthoriented games with sessions that include black lights and glow-in-the-dark playing cards.

INDIANA. When a southern Indiana Knights of Columbus Hall's legal "treasure hunt" jackpot started rising, the anticipation got international attention. For weeks, the hall in Washington, Indiana (a town of 10,000 ) kept seeing no winner. Week after week, still no winner. The pot kept rising. It was nearly 50 weeks before the treasure hunt jackpot was won. The prize was nearly a million dollars. Thousands of people converged on the city. Local charities benefit
from the drawing. And, yes, the city's motels and restaurants were thrilled with the sudden arrival of people from all over the Midwest.

IDAHO. The latest audit figures in Idaho, compiled by that state's racing commission, show that at least one horse track in that state may have strayed from the regulatory straight-and-narrow. Les Bois Park, Idaho's only commercial racing facility, what shut down earlier this year when a bill went through the state legislature banning a level or machines that are cousins of slot machines. There is also confusion in the commission about undistributed funds in the state. More than \$72-million earmarked for state schools has yet to be delivered because the commission has lost some ability to disburse funds.

# Lucky Lotto News 

## All or Nothing First

A father and son from Halstad, Minnesota, both won the $\$ 100,000$ top prize in the state's All or Nothing drawing. Pedro Ruiz, Jr. was on his way to dinner when his father, Pedro Ruiz, Sr., called asking him to purchase All or Nothing tickets for the weekend drawings. Ruiz bought his father's ticket in Gary and later decided to buy his own ticket in Mahnomen. Ruiz, Jr. played the opposite numbers that were on his father's ticket. To win the $\$ 100,000$ top prize a ticket must either match all of the 12 winning numbers or none of the winning numbers. A few hours after the drawing, the family discovered that Ruiz, Sr. was a \$100,000 winner because his ticket did not match any of the winning numbers. Later that night, Ruiz, Jr. realized his ticket matched all of the winning numbers. The Minnesota State Lottery says this is the first time that tickets matching all of the winning numbers and none of the winning numbers were sold for the same drawing.

## Accidental Tickets Wins Big

A New Jersey man has won a multi-state Cash4Life prize worth $\$ 1$ million because of a
lottery ticket that was sold to him accidentally. 70-year-old Dante Castillo won \$1,000 a week for life, but claimed the $\$ 1$ million cash option. Castillo generally picks his own numbers, but a store clerk accidentally sold him one Guick Pick ticket-which turned out to be the winner. Castillo told lottery officials he knew he won after checking the ticket, but returned to the store to double check. The odds of buying a second-prize ticket with a $\$ 2$ ticket are $7,282,016$ to 1 , according to lottery officials. The winning numbers were $17,23,30$, 49 and 55, and Cash Ball was 1.

## Co-workers Score with Powerball

Twenty Tennessee co-workers were the winners of a $\$ 421$ million Powerball jackpot. The employees of the North American Stamping Group in Portland, Tennessee, play the lottery twice a week, buying at least sixty tickets and usually rolling any winnings into the next drawing. Each of the "Tennessee 20" took home about $\$ 12.7$ million. One of the group said that the company's president asked if all 20 would be quitting immediately. While some of the employees are indeed taking early retirement, all promised their boss they would stay on long enough to train replacements.

## Girls Gives Prize to Charity

Phoebe Brown, 7, is a second grade student attending Sycamore Hills Elementary School in Independence, Missouri. One day while shopping with her mother, she came across a lottery ticket on the floor inside a store. Phoebe often picks up discarded lottery tickets, and this time it was a good thing she did. The ticket was a $\$ 100$ winner. Rather than spend the money on herself, however, Phoebe decided to help others. Her school was collecting canned goods for the less fortunate, so the Browns bought \$100 worth of groceries to add to the donations.

## If Bingo was a Sport

British newspaper the Mirror has reported that the number of people playing Bingo in that country has overtaken the number of people who play tennis. According to stats from Sport England, around 1.7 million Brits play tennis every month, compared to 1.9 million monthly Bingo players. Research found that Bingo has rocketed in popularity in recent years, with more players than most sports. According to Sport England, if Bingo were to be considered a sport rather than a game, it would sit firmly in sixth place, pushing tennis to seventh.

## St. Louis Helps Immigrants

The St. Louis (Missouri) Mosaic Project is a regional initiative within the city's Economic Development Partnership, and the World Trade Center St. Louis, which helps foster the idea that immigrants invigorate the region and drive innovation. ## Social Security Benefits

Dear Savvy Senior,
When my 62-year-old brother applied for his retirement benefits early this year, he found that Social Security had made several mistakes on his earnings record in past years. The result was his monthly benefit check was much lower than it should have been. It took him months to straighten it out. How can I prevent this from happening to me? - Social Insecurity

## Dear Insecurity,

The best way to keep an eye on your personal Social Security records is to carefully review your yearly Social Security statements, and don't be surprised if you uncover an error. Government watch groups estimate that the Social Security Administration (SSA) makes mistakes on at least three percent of the total official earnings records it keeps. Here's what you should know.

## Earnings Errors

Social Security benefits
are based on your 35 highestearning years, as reported to the government by your employers. If an employer has given the government incorrect salary data, or if the government has erred in recording the information, you want to get it corrected as quickly as possible. Otherwise you may not get the full amount you're entitled to when you retire. So when you receive your annual Social Security statement, take the time to compare the earnings listed in the statement with income listed on W-2 forms in your tax records. If you spot a discrepancy, follow these steps:

- Call your nearest Social Security office (SEE WWW.SSA. GOV/LOCATOR or call 8000-7721213 to get the number) to report the error. Some corrections can be made over the phone. However, you may need to schedule an appointment and go in with copies of your W2 forms or tax returns to prove the mistake, or you can mail tin.
- If you suspect a discrepancy, but don't have backup records, the SSA maybe be able to use your employment information to search its records and correct mistakes. If the SSA can't locate your records you'll need to contact the employer to obtain a copy of your W -2 for the year in question.
- Once your earnings record is corrected, SSA will send a confirming letter. If you don't receive the confirmation within three months, contact SSA again.

And double check the correction by making sure it appears on next year's statement.

- If corrections aren't made on the next statement you receive, start an appeals process (see ww.ssa.gov/pubs/10041.html).

Note: SSA statements are mailed annually (about three months before your birthday) to everyone age 25 and over who is not already receiving Social Security benefits. If you're not receiving yours, see www.ssa.gov/ mystatement.

## Other Mistakes

Earnings miscalculations can also happen if the SSA didn't have your correct mailing address. If you don't receive your annual statement, that's a tip-off. If there is a mistake, contact the IRS (SSA depends on the IRS for addresses) at 800-829-3676 and ask them to mail you the Change of Address form 8822, or print it off at www. irs.gov/pub/irs-pdf/8822.pdf, fill it out and mail it back to the address on the form.

Two other factors that can cause mistakes are if you changed your name following a marriage or divorce, or if your date of birth in SSA records isn't the same as it appears in IRS files. Double check your SSA statement for these possible mishaps and make sure your earnings data matches the amounts on your W-2 forms. And whenever you change your name, or if you notice a birth date error call the SSA 800-772-1213 and ask
for Form SS-5, Application for a Social Security Card, and submit it with the correct information. The form can also be downloaded at www.ssa.gov/online/ss-5.html.

## Calculation Errors

Even when all the earnings data is correct, the SSA occasionally errs in calculating benefits. You can double check their calculations by using SSA's formula found at wwwsocialsecurity.gov, however the math is rather complex. If you think your benefits have been miscalculated, point it out to your local SSA office and ask them to recalculate. If they do find an error, make sure you receive a confirming letter and that the correction appears on next year's statement. If you're already receiving benefits, the SSA will reimburse you for the amount of the error.

## Dear LuAnne:

The Bingo Bugle is dedicated to keeping Bingo alive and thriving in the USA and beyond. We do this by supporting the Bingo community through articles, photos, advertisements, gaming directories and schedules, puzzles and games, websites, and more.

Obviously, we are never happy to hear about a Bingo game ending. Like you, we know that when it comes to Bingo, the more games there are, the happier Bingo players will be.

I give a lot of credit to the people who step up and take charge of running charity Bingos. It takes a lot of hours with no pay, the only reward coming from knowing that the hard work results in entertainment for Bingo players and much needed dollars for the charities the games sponsor. That's why, whenever I catch a glimpse of a Bingo manager smiling while on the job, I am always impressed.

Unfortunately, managers' efforts only go so far. They need
volunteers to sell the paper, work the room, serve the food, call the numbers and clean up the mess. Equally important, managers need enough players filling the chairs and spending money so that the Bingo games can award good prize amounts with enough left over to support charitable work.

And you can certainly support the hard work of the Bingo manager and crew by letting them know how much you appreciate everything they do-not to mention thinking twice about yelling at the caller or complaining about the service of the volunteers. - Aunt Bingo

## WSOP <br> Main Event

by Chad Holloway

The 2016 World Series of Poker Main Event recently concluded with 39-year-old Gui Nguyen, a native of Vietnam, topping a field of 6,737 players to win an $\$ 8$ million first-place prize.

On the final night of the tournament, which played out Nov. 1 and into the early hours of Nov. 2 at the Rio in Las Vegas and was broadcast live on ESPN, three players returned from the summer's earlier stages of the event to battle it out for the gold championship bracelet. Joining Nguyen were two-time WSOP bracelet winner Cliff "JohnnyBax" Josephy, 51, and Gordon Vayo, 27, the youngest player at the WSOP Main Event final table, which is commonly referred to as the "November Nine."

On just the fourth hand of the evening, one of the biggest pots of the entire tournament played out. With blinds at 600,000-1.2 million plus a 200,000 ante, Josephy, who was sitting with 102.7 million in chips, raised to 2.5 million from the button with 2 s 2 c . Vayo ( 92.9 million) called from the small blind with 3s 3d, Nguyen (141 million) three-bet to 7.7 million from the big blind, and both of his opponents called.

The flop came down 3c Kd 2s,

giving sets to both Josephy and Vayo. After Vayo checked, Nguyen continued for 9.9 million, and both of his opponents called to create a 53.4 million pot.

After the dealer burned and turned the 4d, Vayo checked for a second time, and Nguyen did the same. Josephy then bet 21 million, and Vayo check-raised all in for 75.1 million.

Nguyen quickly folded his hand, and with 149.5 million in the pot, Josephy had a big decision to make. He had 63.9 million behind, but it would cost him 54.1 million to make the call. While Vayo was the player at risk, Josephy was essentially making a decision for his tournament life, as he would be left with just 9.8 million if he called and lost.

Set-over-set hands are among the most brutal in all of poker. They almost always result in big pots, and while one player walks away happy, the other tends to be either decimated or eliminated

In this particular hand, the experts were split on whether Josephy should have folded. Some have argued that pocket threes was the only hand that Vayo would be likely to have, so Josephy should have folded. Others have said that ditching a set was an impossible fold. Cases can be made for either decision, but there was no denying it was a grade-A "cooler" - being dealt a very strong hand only to run up against an even bigger one.

Josephy ended up calling and was left with crumbs after the 6d blanked on the river. He would go out in third place a short time later for $\$ 3.4$ million in winnings. (Vayo finished runner-up for \$4.6 million.) Had Josephy not been the victim of this gut-wrenching set-over-set hand, he could very well have won millions more.

## Bonus Poker

Bonus Poker is a popular video poker game. But not all Bonus Poker games are the same and it's important that you know which ones are better.

Bonus Poker pays even money for a high pair, and 2 for 1 for two pair, which is similar to the payouts for Jacks or Better. The difference in these two games is the payout for quads. Unlike Jacks-or-Better, where all quads pay the same 25 coins per coin bet, with Bonus Poker you get paid 80 for 1 if you have quad aces, and 40 for 1 for quad 2 s though 4 s (the quad 5 s through Ks pay the same amount as they do in Jacks-orBetter, namely 25 for 1 ).

Players like to play Bonus Poker because they enjoy getting more bonus payouts, which occurs when they get the quad aces and quad 2 s through 4 s . This
bonus payout will often quickly turn a losing playing session into a break-even or possibly a winning session, which is another reason players like Bonus Poker.

Unfortunately, the extra quad bonuses come at the expense of a lower payout for the full house and flush. With Jacks-or Better, the best payoff for the full house and flush is 9 coins and 6 coins respectively per coin played (known as 9/6 Jacks-or-Better) With Bonus Poker, you get short changed one coin on the full house and another on the flush, meaning the best Bonus Poker games pay $8 / 5$. The expected return (ER) for an $8 / 5$ Bonus Poker game is also slightly lower than

9/6 Jacks-or-Better (99.17\% vs. 99.54\%).

The following table summarizes the different pay schedules you will find in casinos that offer Bonus Poker. (The $8 / 5,7 / 5$, and $6 / 5$ refers to the payout for full house and flush respectively).

Notice that you get more bang for your buck if you play only an $8 / 5$ Bonus Poker machine rather than the short pay $7 / 5$ and $6 / 5$ versions.

Here's another tip. Some casinos offer $8 / 5$ Bonus Poker but two pair only pays even money instead of 2 for 1 (ouch!). This is a real rip-off so be sure you check the entire pay schedule to be certain it matches the above pay
schedule before you insert your cash and start playing.

IGT has a bonus game on their video poker machines that they call "Bonus Poker" even though all quads are paid the same amount (the best pay schedules pay 35 or 30 coins per coin played for quads) with the full house and flush paying $8 / 5$. The EV for the 35/8/5 game is a respectable 99.66\% (which is slightly higher than the above 80/40/25/8/5 Bonus Poker game). The EV for the 30/8/5 game is only $98.48 \%$; therefore, check the payouts for the quads on any IGT Bonus Poker game before you play.

## What's New in Nevada

More Wynn Retail
Wynn Resorts Limited tells media that it is entering into a joint venture with the large-scale real estate firm Crown Acquisitions that would mean that Wynn would own and operate an additional shopping mall it is building along the Las Vegas Strip. According to published reports, Wynn says that the east coast real estate company (based in Manhattan) would hold a $49.9 \%$ stake at the future Wynn Plaza development. The area would sit adjacent to nearly 89-thousand square feet of retail space already in the hands of Wynn Las Vegas and its properties division.

## Beano's to PT's Gold

The group PT Entertainment tells media it is converting the former Beano's Casino, a pub located on West Lake Mead Boulevard, into a PT's Gold facility. The property, near the intersection of West Lake Mead and busy US 95 , has been dark for most of the year while renovations have
proceeded. The new facility will have about 6,000 -square feet of gaming activities. The number of machines will be greatly expanded from the number found when the building was strictly a "pub."

For decades, since the start of modern-day Las Vegas, only a few casinos, mostly in congested downtown blocks, charged for parking. And, according to one published commentary, much of the anger is not over the fees themselves, but over the way huge lines form at the checkout kiosks when major events are over. I would like to make a romantic dinner for my husband for Valentine's Day. It will be our 40th wedding anniversary. Can you make any suggestions? Also, he loves meat! Please keep most of the recipes simple! - Rosemary J. in Boise, Idaho

## Dear Rosemary,

Congratulations on your upcoming anniversary. I would suggest a menu including shrimp cocktail; a fresh salad with sliced beefsteak tomatoes; filet mignon with either a bearnaise sauce (Knorr's packet) or a bottled steak sauce like A-1 (hide the bottle); fresh veggies such as asparagus, brussel sprouts or cauliflower; a twice-baked potato; and a fantastic dessert like an Ice Box Cake. Make the dessert the day before. -Annie

## TWICE-BAKED POTATO

2 large Idaho potatoes, pre-baked Whipping cream
Butter or margarine
Salt

Pepper
Paprika
Carefully slice the potatoes in half. Remove the pulp, leaving the skins as intact as possible. Mix the potato pulp in a medium size bowl and add the cream, butter, salt and pepper. Mix thoroughly. Fill the four potato shells with the potato mixture. Sprinkle with paprika. Bake for 15 minutes at 350 degrees in a pre-heated oven. Serve immediately.

ICE BOX CAKE
2 packages Ladyfingers - separated (unfilled)
$1 / 2$ gallon ice cream- allow to thaw for 15-20 minutes (your choice of flavor)
3 bars German Sweet Chocolate $1 / 4$ cup sugar
3 eggs (beaten)
Whipped cream (aerosol can) 1 pint fresh strawberries (stems removed and sliced)
1 spring form cake pan
Line sides and bottom of spring form pan with the ladyfingers (leave curved side of pastry facing the pan). Fill any empty spaces with broken pieces. Add softened ice cream carefully to spring form. Place in freezer for at least 30 minutes. Melt 3 bars of German Sweet Chocolate in a double boiler. Remove from the heat. Add sugar and beaten eggs. Pour on top of the ice cream. Return to freezer for at least two hours or overnight. Serve with whipped cream and sliced strawberries. May use 1 or 2 flavors of ice cream.
