Minutes of the February 1, 2018 Meeting

The February 1, 2018 meeting of the Austin Shutterbug Club was convened by President Brian Loflin at 7:00 p.m. at the Northwest Recreation Center.

Brian announced that there were 67 present at the meeting including seven guests. He then introduced guests Ayash Basu, Anne Duncan, Jack Lehman, Robert Ottogalli, Cathey Roberts, Mike Stys, and Christian Suobodon.

Brian then thanked Richard and Joyce Bennett for providing refreshments for the evening. Treasurer Lois Schubert collected dues.

VP of Programs, Stennis Shotts, discussed upcoming events. A schedule of Meetings, Guest Speakers, and Outings was shown on the screen. Stennis first emphasized the importance of the Class to be held on March 3, 2018 from 10:30 - 1:00 at the Old Quarry Branch Library. The topic will be second in the series of "Beyond the Basics."

Stennis then reported on the planned photography trips beginning with the trip to Fossil Rim Wildlife Center on February 3 - 4, 2018. It was reported that 41 had signed up and details of the trip were discussed.

Stennis then highlighted the Wild Flower trip on March 24 and reported that 36 had already signed up.

The Field trip to High Island on April 13 - 16 was also reported on and four locations for photographing birds was displayed on the screen.

The Field trip to New Orleans on May 6 - 11 will include two nights at Metairie and three nights at the Omni in downtown New Orleans. Stennis said that it was important for members desiring to participate in the trips to sign up as quickly a possible since space is limited.

Steve Houston, Co-Chair Exhibits, then announced that the North Hills Gallery Exhibit will commence on May 29, 2018 and that the Call for Entries will probably be sent out in March.

Brian next introduced Kelley Ahr, a member of the Club, to present the program, the topic being Conceptual Photographic Art, a type of photography that conveys an idea using photographic images and photo-editing software.

Kelley discussed the four steps of developing a conceptual art piece including finding inspiration, taking the photo which is probably the easiest step, compositing in Photoshop, and color grading and finishing touches.

Using Photoshop, Kelley demonstrated each step in creating an art piece and at the end of her presentation provided a handout showing each step she had taken in developing the composite.

Tonight's meeting adjourned at 8:47 p.m.

2018 Assignments

March - Landscape Panorama Color or Monochrome

May - Patterns in Nature: color or monochrome

July - Yellow: Color only. Focus and principle subject of the image must be something yellow.

September - You are challenged to create an image of a person or persons that tells the viewer something distinctive about them without including the face. Okay to show the head, just not the face. It could show their age, profession, hobby, economic status, etc. Monochrome or color.

November - **Black & White**: Photograph whatever your heart desires. It is your choice BUT it must be entered as a pure Black and White, no color. Must have good black point and good white point with shades of gray tonalities.

2019 Assignments

January - The Color White: Okay, so white is all colors, but you know what we mean. Photograph anything you want, but the subject must be white. Make sure you have a good white point (and a good black point, as well). Color or, dare I say it, Black & White.

March - 3's in Nature: No hand of Man or Woman allowed. Rocks, flowers, trees, wild animals, etc. Be creative! Can be color or Black & White.

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South Texas Bird Photography Workshops New dates for 2018

Copious instruction will include hands-on demonstrations in bird photography, understanding best exposures and camera settings, and the use of flash. Instruction will also include how to



set up in a blind and shooting etiquette, setting up perches, best management of light and backgrounds and much, much more.

The equipment of choice is a Digital SLR camera and zoom lenses in the 200 mm or longer focal length with tele-converter and extension tube options. Some photographers enjoy lenses of 400 to 600 mm in focal length. A dedicated flash with Better-Beamer style flash extender is an ideal option. Bring your laptop for image downloads and review.

Accommodations will be at the nearby ECHO Hotel in Edinburg, Texas. Participants will have mini-suites, a welcome spot to unwind and relax. Dinners will be served in the dining room and nearby resturants and group discussions and refreshments may follow in the evenings. TV and Wi-Fi internet connections are available.
