EQUITATION DIVISIONS

Leadline (1-3): Open to children six (6) years of age or under. To be judged on manners and suitability of mount to rider. Will be asked to trot. Not eligible for any other non-leadline classes. Division will be walk only, AHS Walk-Trot, Off Leaders.

Walk/Trot Division (4-6): Open to junior and adult amateur riders on horses and ponies. Riders may not cross enter into any cantering or jumping classes. To consist of one Walk Eq class, one Walk-Trot Eq class, and one Walk-Trot Pleasure class.

Mini Stirrup Division (7-10): Open to juniors eight years and younger. Riders may not cross enter into any jumping classes at the same horse show. Riders are eligible for any appropriate flat class. Division will be WT, WT Pleasure, WT Figure Eight, WT Poles.

Short Stirrup Equitation Division (11-14): Open to children twelve (12) years of age and under on horses and ponies who have not competed in any show over fences exceeding 2'. Fences at 18". Division will be WT, WTC and two classes of crossrails.

Beginner Equitation Division (19-22): Open to all juniors who have not shown in more than eight horse shows in any one year. Riders cannot jump more than 2' in any horse show and may cross enter into Modified Hunter. Division will be WT, WTC, two classes of crossrails.

Novice Equitation Division (43-46): Open to junior and adult amateur riders on horses or ponies. Riders may not have competed at 26" or higher. To be judged on hands, seat, and control of mount. Fences 2' or 2'3" at rider's discretion. Division will be WTC class and three O/F.

Open Equitation (55-58): Open to junior and adult amateur riders on horses or ponies. To be judged on hands, seat, and control of mount. Fences 2'6" or 2'9" at rider's discretion. Division will be WTC and three O/F.

HUNTER & PLEASURE DIVSIONS

All Hunter Divisions will be three classes Over Fences and one Under Saddle unless otherwise stated. Junior/Adult Pleasure (27-29): Open to any type of pony or horse suitable for use as a pleasure mount. To be ridden by a junior or adult amateur. Judged on performance, manners, and suitability of mount to rider. No martingales. Classes will be WT, WTC and 4 poles.

Short Stirrup Hunter Division (15-18): Open to riders twelve (12) years of age and under. Horse/pony/rider may only cross enter into Short Stirrup Equitation and Junior Pleasure at the same show.

Modified Hunter (23-26): Open to all junior and adult amateur riders on horses and ponies. Rider may not have shown higher that 2'3" in any show. May only cross enter into Long Stirrup, Beginner Eq., 2' Equitation or pleasure at the same show. Fences 2'. Horse and rider combination cannot ride in division for more than two (2) years.

Pre-Children's Hunter Division (39-42): Open to junior riders still eligible for Novice Equitation Over Fences at any rated show (have not won three blue ribbons in equitation). Ponies to jump at 2', horses 2'6". May not cross enter into any Children's Hunter class or division on same mount.

Pre-Adult Hunter Division (47-50): Open to adult amateurs on either ponies or horses. Fence heights to be at 2'6" Riders may not cross enter into Modified Hunter or Long Stirrup Division at the same show. Children's/Adult Hunter Division (51-54): Open to horses and ponies ridden by juniors or Adult Amateurs. Small/medium ponies 2', large ponies 2'6" and horses 3'. May not cross enter into any Pre-Children's Hunter class or division, or Pre-Adult Hunter class or division on the same mount.

Low Schooling Hunter (31-34): Open to all riders on horses or ponies. Fences at 2' or 2'3" at rider's discretion, to be designated on entry form.

High Schooling Hunter (35-38): Open to all riders on horses or ponies. Fences 2'6" or 3' at rider's discretion, to be designated on entry form.

TB Hunter Division (59-62): Open to Thoroughbred horses/ponies. To be shown over rider's choice of fences heights: 2'3" or 2'9". Not to be combined with any other division.

JUMPER DIVISIONS

The first class of the division will be Table II, Sec. 2(b) The second class of the division will be Table II, Sec. (1)

Champion and Reserve Champion will be awarded to the highest scoring horse in the two classes.

Low Schooling Jumper (65-66): Open to all riders on horses and ponies. Jumps to be 2'3"

High Schooling Jumper (67-68): Open to all riders on horses and ponies. Jumps to be 2'6".

High Schooling Jumper (69-70): Open to all riders on horses and ponies. Jumps to be 3'. Open Jumper (71): Open to all. Section A: Fences 3'6" Section B: 4'.

Open Jumper Derby (72): May include fences on the grass field, weather permitting. Section A: Fences 3'6" Section B: 4'

EQUITATION MEDAL CLASSES

Two tests will be built into the first round, no further testing:

- 73. M&S 2'6" Children's Medal Open to junior riders.
- M&S 2'6" Adult Medal/NJHSA Open to Adult Amateur riders.
- M&S Children's Medal/NJHSA 2'Small/Medium ponies, 2'6" Large ponies, 3' Horses


