The Secret Ingredient for Good Stewardship: Worship

Eventually, I discovered something ... there is no better way to give thanks than with a gift. When someone does something nice we often give them a gift to say thank you. When you love someone, you want to give them thingsgifts that say, "I love you."

Did you know that this is why we have offerings during the church service? I didn't know that for a long time. I used to think it was because the church needed to collect some money to pay its bills, so every Sunday, we'd take a little break from worship and pass the plates around.

The church does need to pay its bills, of course, but it doesn't have to take up an offering on Sunday mornings to do that. People can mail in their money or set up an electronic transfer with their bank. The reason we have an offering on Sunday morning is to give people a chance to say "Thank you" to God," or to offer a gift that says, "I love you."

In ancient Israel people would bring sacrifices of wheat or animals to the altar. They didn't do this because the temple or

tabernacle needed their crops or flockthe wheat and the animals were simply consumed in flames. They did it to worship God, to show their gratitude and love by giving up something of value to them.

Once I figured that out, the offering became my favorite part of the service. I do have a fund transfer set up at my bank, and my pledged monthly support for the church comes from that. And, I still bring something each week to put in the offering plate. I come with a gift of thanks for God in my pocket and wait eagerly through most of the service for that plate to come around. I've told my pastor, If you ever think the service is going to be too long, cut out one of the hymns or cut part of your sermon. But don't you ever cut out the offering! That's what I'm here for! To worship God and to give God a gift because I am so thankful to God for being so good! - Mark Allan Powell from Faith+Lead

On an unrelated note, I recently finished reading <u>China Men</u> by Maxine Hong Kingston, a book that introduces the reader to many generations of men in her family, but not in any order. The best part of the introductions – the author begins a section with "great-greatgrandfather is said to have stowed away on board a ship bound for Hawai'i when he was ten years old; it is also said that he fell overboard and rode on the back of a whale for several hours until rescued by a fisherman; or..." and then she tells some perfectly believable tale about the same person. I am intrigued by her hints at family legends and the concept that perhaps none of the tales are true. It was an excellent read. I first met Kingston at a National Council of Teachers of English national conference, I can't remember where, just somewhere out west, perhaps Seattle. She was the featured speaker. I remember her elaborating on her gift of writing. She mentioned that she had recently finished a book. And then a fire swept through the hills of northern Oakland. She raced home hoping to rescue her only copy of the finished manuscript. Her house destroyed around her, when she touched the papers, they crumbled into ash. Fire and loss. She could never rewrite nor did she want to try to recreate the destroyed book. What a spellbinding story.

The book club finished out October with the read of Marilynne Robinson's <u>Gilead</u>, a book that garnered mixed reviews from the club members. A late-in-life father and minister of his church is on his deathbed. He wants to leave his 7-year-old son some words of wisdom that would make his fathering this child more meaningful. The words of wisdom turn into a commentary of the momentous occasions in the father's life. The book is quite a study of fathers and sons and how that relationship works.
