MY WEAK, LITTLE FAITH

The apostles said to the Lord, "Increase our faith." (Lk 17:5-10). The apostles are finally growing up! Compared to some of their requests and questions (sitting at His left or right, who is the greatest, calling down fire on an obstinate Samaritan village, etc), their request today is so commendable and relevant to their salvation and to the mission Jesus is preparing them to do. Rather than an elaborate theological dissertation on faith, Jesus answers in very few words, using the analogy of the mustard seed. His answer is so inspiring and so deep that today, it still speaks to us in very clear, simple, powerful, inspiring, and comforting ways.

Have you ever heard of the saying about someone being a little bit pregnant? Of course this is followed by the explanation that a woman is either pregnant or not pregnant, no half ways. In Mk 4:30-32, Jesus also says that the Kingdom of God is like a mustard seed that once sown, grows up to become a big tree. In essence, the mustard seed is simply a mustard seed, with all the potentials of growing into a full mustard tree.

This Sunday, Jesus is simply, powerfully, consolingly, inspiringly telling us that our faith likewise is simply what it is, faith! He's teaching us that every faith, yes, even our doubtful, almost extinguished faith, is still faith and has the potential of growing into a powerful force, if and when given the opportunity to do so.

What then must we do? Well, every parish has a host of activities and events geared towards helping parishioners fan their faith into a powerful consuming flame. Those who utilize them continuously bear witness to the great things God is doing in their lives and those around them see what God is indeed doing through them. Here at St. Bart's, apart from our Sunday Masses, our weekly bulletin is filled with spiritual and social events that help us to activate our faith, fan it into greater flame, and put it into practice, for faith without good works is dead.

It's up to each one of us, with the help of the Holy Spirit to own our 'little faith' and nurture it into the force we want it to be. May God bless our efforts with success. Amen!
