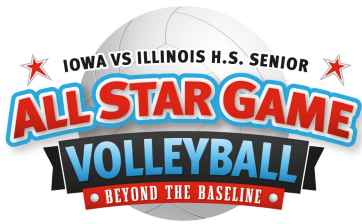

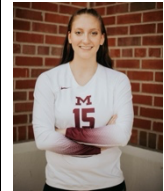
Aylah Jones – Erie Prophetstown High School – Parents Joe and Julie Jones

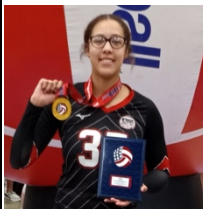
Chloe Bell – Bettendorf High School – Parents Steve and Robin Bell

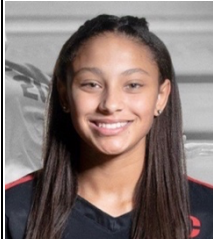


Siena Roethler – Pleasant Valley High School – Parents Jason and Eileen Roethler

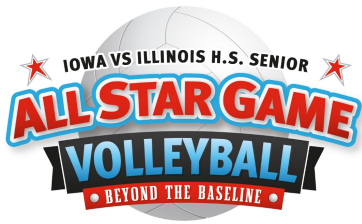
Ava Schubert Assumption High School – Parents Amy and Brian Schubert
