

This Sunday we celebrate the feast of Epiphany. The feast of Epiphany is actually January 6th but it is usually moved to the nearest Sunday. The 12 days in between December 25th and January 6th are the '12 days of Christmas' referred to in the popular carol. The feast of Epiphany officially ends the Christmas season. In the Roman rite of the Catholic Church, Epiphany celebrates the revelation that Jesus was the Son of God. It focuses primarily on this revelation to the Three Wise Men, but also in his baptism in the Jordan and at the wedding at Cana. The gifts the wise men brought - frankincense, myrrh and gold - point not only to Christ's divinity and his revelation to the Magi as the King of Kings, but also to his crucifixion, in giving herbs traditionally used for burial. In the early Church, the celebration of Epiphany actually predates the celebration of Christmas on December 25th. (Excerpts from an article by Adelaide Mena. C.N.A.)
