The Reverend's Ruminations - August 2023

Greetings in the name of Christ our Savior! As I "ruminate" upon the month ahead, I pray that the temperatures and humidity will moderate a bit from these final days of July. Summer is always going to be warm (even hot, depending on who you ask), but oppressive dew points really take the fun out of a southern Minnesota day or evening! Ellen and I, like many of you, have a much-needed tent camping vacation planned during much of the 2nd and 3rd weeks of August, so we're hopeful that western South Dakota and Wyoming will have conducive weather for such an adventure.

In the meantime, I want to thank you for the many prayers, well wishes, and cards following my recent surgery to repair a long-time deviated septum. As in many cases, the recovery is the longer, harder part of such a procedure. The outer "cast" and inner tubes were removed from my nose just a week after the surgery, but then the soft tissue swelling set in! So while I can tell that my breathing is going to be much more balanced between both nostrils, right now it still feels as if I'm very congested. Complete healing is predicted to take as much as 3-5 months, but the swelling should continue to decrease substantially in the next few weeks and allow my breathing to be much freer.





What some already know about the day of my surgery is that it was not as early as many such procedures, meaning that after four hours in the operating room and a couple more to come out of anesthesia and be released, we were travelling home from Rochester as the sun set. Nearing Fairmont in the dark, we hit a deer in the I-90 construction zone on the western edge of Blue Earth. We were uninjured, but definitely upset to end such a day by leaving my car for a tow truck on the Huntley exit ramp!?! After several days and a bit of runaround, my insurance company finally decided that fixing a 2003 Honda Element was not feasible and declared it totaled. My coverage on it was good, so I hope to find a worthy replacement soon!

Despite these challenges and setbacks, I (as I hope you do) hold tight to the everlasting refuge found in God's protection. The author of Psalms, so frequently a voice for our fears or frustrations, is also a source of affirmations to which we cling. Such is the case in the opening of Psalm 57: "Be merciful to me, O God, be merciful to me! For my soul trusts in You; and in the shadow of Your wings I will make my refuge, until these calamities have passed by" (57:1, NKJV). Everyday "calamities" are rarely long-lived, and with God's calming presence to uphold us, the ensuing days usually dawn brighter than the "pit" to which the Psalmist so frequently refers.

As our third month of Minnesota summer progresses, I pray that you and your family find the rest and refreshment of time spent together, the opportunity of experiencing beautiful surroundings, and the assurance of God's continual presence in your lives.

Hy-Vee & Fareway Report as of 23 July 2023



During the last five weeks, \$13,987.41 (6.99%) worth of Hy-Vee slips were received. After 30 weeks, Hy-Vee is at \$115,267.77 (57.63%) toward the 16th goal which is now \$200,000. We have been getting to the \$150,000 goal in about 44 weeks and the new \$200,000 will take almost 60 weeks.

During the same time, \$3,826.37 (2.42%) worth of Fareway slips were received. After 16 weeks, Fareway is at \$18,362.06 (12.24%) toward our 5th \$150,000 goal.

This program started the first of March 2011, so any slips from then until now can be used. Any Fairmont Fareway and Hy-Vee food store register slip can be used. Even slips from Hy-Vee Fast & Fresh (Gas), Coffee Shop, Food Service, and Pharmacy help us toward the goal. Thanks to all who bring/mail the slips to the Church, or mailing them or dropping them off at my house. Even the very small amounts help.





Hot Chicken Salad (from Christina Hainy)

4 C cooked, diced chicken (small pieces or shredded)
2 Tbsp lemon juice
³/₄ C mayo
1 tsp salt
2 C diced celery
4 hard-boiled eggs-diced
1 can cream of chicken soup
1 tsp grated onion
Small jar pimento, drained
1 C shredded cheddar cheese

Mix and place in a $9 \ge 13$ inch pan. Bake 20–25 minutes at 400 degrees.

Topping:

1 ½ C crushed potato chips 2/3 C sliced almonds, toasted (To toast: Bake on a baking sheet at 350 degrees for 5-8 minutes until light golden brown. Watch carefully & stir 1 or 2 times.)

During the last few minutes of baking, add the topping.
