It is commonly known that we celebrate eight days of Chanukah because of the great miracle of the oil, that one day's supply of oil burned for eight days. Rabbi Jacob ben Asher, known as the Tur for his authorship of an important work of Jewish law, asks a seemingly obvious question: because there was enough oil to naturally burn for one day, are we not left with only seven days of miracle; why do we celebrate for eight days? Before I present my answer – which is always just one of a number of approaches to any question – please know that this question has a greater multiplicity of answers than most any other. There's actually a book that was written entitled *Ner l'meah*, (a light for one hundred) which gives over 100 different answers to this question!

One of the most popular approaches is that the first day we celebrate is in recognition of the military victory, while the remaining seven days correspond to the seven days that the burning of the oil was miraculously extended.

As background to our approach we do well to understand as best as we can the ways Jews understood and celebrated the miracle of Chanukah in the first centuries after 165 b.c.e. (the year of the victory over the Seleucid Greeks).

Of the earliest responses to the successful rebellion and the rededication of the Temple was, in the words of the mishnaic sages, "*hodaya*", giving

thanks to G-d, which was formalized in our *al hanissim* prayer recited each day of the holiday in both the amidah and the Grace After Meals. This prayer clearly emphasizes the military victory as the essential miracle, while the menorah is only obliquely referenced as "they kindled lights in Your holy courtyard". Josephus, writing in the first century c.e., describes the holiday as a time of

torch-lit marches celebrating the military victory. Only after the Bar Kochba rebellion, when the Sages took a decidedly pacifist approach to Messianic redemption, does the primary emphasis move from the military miracle to the miracle of the menorah.

Blessed with our State of Israel, we live in a time

where we celebrate the miracle of survival that our People have earned through many a military miracle. It is thus only appropriate that after giving credit to our soldiers we immediately continue to give a more extended and deeper praise to G-d for, despite all that is arrayed against us, He has allowed us the opportunity to build the great miracle of a thriving Jewish state. Let us light our menorahs each night in praise of G-d's miracles *bayamim hahem bazman hazeh*, in those days at this season, and *bayamim hahem u'bazman hazeh*, in those days and in ours.
