

I'm planning on attending Mid-Ohio again this year & I hope you all can do the same. In the past we have trailered our bikes up there; it's about a 10-hour drive on the Interstate. You could ride out on US 40, which I hear is a pretty nice ride, but it's the coming back on Sunday that might be a little tough. Of course, if you could take your time on the return, it would be a great trip. Normally we depart on Thursday morning (July 15 this year), Vintage Motorcycle Days are Friday, Saturday, and Sunday, and we return on Sunday (18th). But if you were so inclined, you could leave Monday morning from Honey Creek & ride to the Norton National, which will be held the following week in Northeastern Ohio-just an hour or two ride from Mid-Ohio. Heck, if you've ridden that far, go ahead-make a week of it!

In the past we have stayed at Honey Creek Campground which is about 8 miles from the track in Belleville, Ohio; they have a website-do a Google search. You can stay at the track (costs extra to camp there) but we've enjoyed the privacy of the off-site campground. They have showers there & plenty of space for everybody - we camp in a shady field next to a hillside & it's great! Amazingly, the weather has been fine for the last 3 years & even though it's the middle of July, I've needed to wear my leather around the campfire at night. Virtually no mosquitoes or chiggers. It's really a good time.




