

Programs

Fall is here, and we have a busy year ahead with a lot of different speakers on the agenda before next year's elections.

September 8 will bring the always informative and entertaining San Diego City Councilmen **Scott Sherman**, and Councilman **Chris Cates**. The city budget, infrastructure, retention and hiring in the police department and more, rank high among the challenges facing San Diego.

Businessman and Councilman for District 7, Scott Sherman brings a wealth of knowledge to the San Diego City Council. Among the many projects he is involved with include the Charger Stadium controversy. The decision deadline is September 11, so will be at the top of the list of questions. Councilman Sherman will be up for reelection next year, and wants to continue his community based efforts, working on fiscal responsibility with taxpayer dollars, and creating joint use parks and public spaces.

An advocate for public safety, economic development and the environment, fist year Councilman Chris Cate is focused on doing all he can for his constituents in District 6. Before his election to the San Diego City Council, Chris served as Vice President of the San Diego County Taxpayers Association. As a long-time taxpayer advocate, he championed local and state legislation, which ensured that cities and public agencies exercise accountability, efficiency and fiscal discipline on behalf of the taxpayers who fund them.

The **October 13** meeting will once again bring us two speakers on very current topics. **Tia Quick**, Deputy District Attorney assigned as the law enforcement liaison to the San Diego Police Department will address Proposition 47, Criminal Sentences. Misdemeanor Penalties. Initiative Statute., a referendum passed by voters in California in 2014, and what the consequences have been to our state and penal system.



FACEBOOK POST? NEWS FEED? TWITTER TWEET? What Are You Talking About? Terry Casey



It was late in 2007 when, then presidential candidate, Barack Obama first fully utilized the power of electronic communications in a presidential campaign that instantaneously provided personal status and information to his millions of followers around the nation and the world. Within seconds, BO could share his personal perspective with his over 2 ½ million followers through Facebook and/or Twitter.

As many of you know, Facebook is the social networking web site that was created over ten years ago. The site was quickly picked up around the world as a way to bypass snail mail to communicate between young people. Twitter was later created once the use of smart phones became prevalent and everyone seemed to want to be electronically attached 24/7. Of course, we all know that those "Posts" (on Facebook) and "Tweets" (on Twitter) were never personally originated by BO but by his army of publicists and PR staff. Soon, parents and adults jumped in to both technologies. That drove the kids off to Pinterest, Instagram, etc. but that's another story for another day.
