

Horse racing continues in the Rincker family

Otto Rincker, a lifelong resident of Strasburg, became interested in horse racing when his uncle Loyd Rincker raced thoroughbred horses. Otto has been going to the races since he was 8 years old. He had a couple of horses in his name, but never had the opportunity to actually own a racehorse until he and Zed Brehmer bought a trotter from a friend of Zed's. That horse didn't do as well as expected so it was sold. Otto became acquainted with a trainer by the name of Kenny Collier. Kenny has had success in the standardbred horse racing world, so Otto had him look for a horse. Otto and Zed worked with Kenny for a year or so before Zed decided to get out of the horse business.

Currently, Otto and his wife Lisa own 3 horses. They are:

- 1) **Kansas Boy** is a 2-year-old, Indiana bred, gelding. He ran really well this year in his first year of racing, earning around \$65,000. He ran mainly at a Harrah's Hoosier Park racetrack in Anderson, Indiana, and is done for the season but will start again in April 2025.
- 2) **Ultimate Fantasy** is a 2-year-old Indiana bred filly. She is set to make her racing debut soon.
- 3) **Comet Country** is a yearling Indiana bred gelding. He is currently being jogged and taught the tricks of the trade. Lisa came up with that name.

Their trainer, Kenny Collier and his wife Jo, live at Ellery, IL, close to Fairfield, IL. Otto and Lisa describe Kenny as a kind and gentle man, who loves what he does and loves animals, and Jo is the groomswoman for the horses and is the best caregiver a horse could have.

Local residents organize to help with Hurricane Relief

Hurricane Helene swept through the Florida upper peninsula as a Category 4 storm on September 26. The storm brought severe damage and flooding across the southern Appalachians causing hundreds of fatalities and billions in property damage. Several local residents responded by quickly organizing and taking donations and supplies to Tennessee and North Carolina.

Twila Newell-Faletic (daughter of Tom and Leslie Newell) was sitting at home without power on a Thursday night when she told her husband that she was going to take a load of items to help the hurricane victims. Two days

later, on Oct. 5, through significant help and donations from family and co-workers, Twila and her niece, Madi

Haarmann were able to get a pickup truck load of supplies to Newport, TN.

Heather Thompson Brockett (daughter of Steve & Connie Thompson), who currently lives in Tennessee and was a graduate of Stew-Stras High School, was instrumental in supplying Twila with information and connections. Heather receives daily information on current needs and connected Twila with the Lincoln Avenue Baptist Church in Newport as her drop off point.

While there, Twila observed firsthand the devastation of those affected by the flooding. Many homes that used to sit close to the river were left with only

foundations, while homes across town were not affected. Newport had just gotten back power and water when she arrived. The outlying areas were still without.

Twila is planning a return trip, this time with husband Lorne, and their two children to Swannanoa, North Carolina. They will be leaving Friday, Nov. 8 with 1 or 2 vehicles. As needs change daily, Twila will post on Facebook (her personal page and "Strasburg, IL: Right In The Middle of Everything!" group page) the current needs around November 5 or 6 and donations will need to be delivered to them after that.



"We're not that far from them", stated Twila. "In just a day we can be there."

Matt & Michelle (Webb) Figgins took a load of supplies for hurricane victims in a 20' enclosed trailer on October 9. They delivered to Pole Creek Baptist Church in Candler, NC. Several supplies came from the students of Stewardson-Strasburg High School as the student council organized a relief drive.



Michelle also worked with Heather Brockett to bring the right supplies to the area. Michelle posts updates on her Facebook page about progress and needs. They are also planning a return trip in

Laura Henning of Strasburg knew she needed to help victims of the hurricane and within a couple of days had 3 tons of supplies which she delivered to Burnsville, NC on Oct. 4-6. She experienced several road closures and traffic delays along the way. For this trip Laura took mainly baby items, pet supplies, generators and chain saws. She is also planning a return trip to the Appalachians.

Former residents experience first major hurricane

Hurricane Milton hit the west coast of Florida on October 9 and moved east across the state. John and Cathy (Rothrock) Reel, son Jeremy and daughter Courtney, former Strasburg residents, gave us these updates on their experiences. They knew days ahead and prepared well for the ravages of the hurricane at their home near Orlando, Florida. They filled their vehicles with gas several days in advance as gas stations were empty or totally backed up with customers a day or two before the storm hit. Knowing they could be without water, they bought bottled water, filled buckets of water and even filled the bathtub with water.



John and Cathy both worked a partial day on October 9. As the storm hit the west coast, much damage and flooding was done along the Gulf side of the state. As the storm moved inland, it lost some intensity and although the Reels experienced some wind damage, they never lost power. John attributes part of the safety to living in the middle of the state. One thing they miss about their Illinois home is their basement.

Mitch Stewart, Strasburg, is a contractor for Ameren. He recently returned from working on electrical lines in the SE. He left Sept. 30 for Wythe County Virginia where they worked restoring power until October 6. On. Oct. 8, he left for Tampa, Florida and returned on Oct. 19.


