# "The Authority of Jesus" Luke 20:1-8

### I. God's authority will often face oppositions in a fallen world.

**Luke 20:1** "On one of the days while He was teaching the people in the temple and preaching the gospel, the chief priests and the scribes with the elders confronted Him"

- A. The strongest opposition came from those who has religious authority *Luke 9:22.* 
  - 1. They rejected the authority of the messenger. (Moses, prophets, Jesus)
- B. Why would religious people reject the Lord? Two reasons: Contempt, Jealousy, and Fear
  - 1. Contempt for Jesus –
  - 2. Jealousy of Jesus \_\_\_\_\_
  - 3. Fear of Jesus \_\_\_\_\_(John 11:47-50)
- C. **Application:** Expect opposition from people as you do the will of God. *Jn 15:20*
- II. He who has the authority has power and the right.

*Luke 20:2* "and they spoke, saying to Him, "Tell us by what authority You are doing these things, or who is the one who gave You this authority?"

- A. What is AUTHORITY? The NT word is *exousia*, meaning rightful, actual and unimpeded power to act, or to possess, control, use or dispose of, something or somebody. It a power that is in some sense lawful.
- B. The first question dealt with the kind of authority Jesus used.
- C. The second question dealt with who was backing Him.
- D. Application: Recognize this day the authority of Jesus' teaching over your life? -*Mt 28:18-20*
- III. All lawful authority is given by God.

### A. Jesus redirects the question to the authority of John.

*Luke 20:3* "Jesus answered and said to them, "I will also ask you a question, and you tell Me: 4 "Was the baptism of John from heaven or from men?"

- B. Our Lord's question was an answer to the question of His opponents.
- C. **Application:** Recognize the authority of those whom God has given it to.
  - 1. Human institutions 1 Peter 2:13–14
  - 2. Spiritual leaders Hebrews 13:17

### IV. All Lawful authority must be submitted to. They knew it too.

- A. His opponents were unwilling to openly confess John's authority: Luke 20:5 "They reasoned among themselves, saying, "If we say, 'From heaven,' He will say, 'Why did you not believe him?'
- **B. They refused to openly deny John as a prophet Luke 20:6** "But if we say, 'From men,' all the people will stone us to death, for they are convinced that John was a prophet."
- **C.** They lied claiming ignorance to protect their credibility *Luke* **20:7** "So they answered that they did not know where it came from."
- D. Application: Submit to the authorities God has placed over us?
- V. God does not waste Truth on pretenders. -

*Luke 20:8* "And Jesus said to them, "Nor will I tell you by what authority I do these things."

- A. Those that bury the knowledge they have, are justly denied further knowledge.
- B. The willingly ignorant have no claim on further knowledge. *Matthew 7:6*
- C. Application: Hang on to the truth and live it. Prov 3:3-4

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
