PEOPLE OF THE LIGHT

We are called to reflect the light of God's love through the ways in which we live our lives. Imagine the impact if each of us took this call to heart, every day, at home, work, or school, in our parish, in the world. "All nations shall stream toward it," toward the love that only comes from God. Yet, we must admit that much of the time we fail to be beacons of God's light. We fall asleep, complacent, preferring to go the easy route, which often leads to darkness rather than the radiance of Christ's light. As we begin the season of Advent, Saint Paul admonishes us to throw off the works of darkness, to awaken to the call of light and love. In today's Gospel, Jesus too tells us to stay awake, to be prepared to greet the Lord of light as people of the light.



THE SEASON OF ADVENT

What are we really waiting for during Advent? The longstanding tradition of the Church is that the Advent season really marks not one but three comings of Christ: his coming into history two thousand years ago, his coming in glory at the end of time, and his coming into our hearts here and now. Advent starts with a focus on the future coming of Christ so that we might see the big picture. If Christmas is to make any sense at all, we have to ask the question, "What are you doing to get ready for the (final) coming of Christ?" This perspective opens us up to the sense of anticipation experienced by the Jewish people on the eve of the first coming of Christ. This Advent, we will hear John the Baptist tell them (and us) how best to prepare. He urges repentance and an examination and reform of our way of life. Then on the Fourth Sunday, we are drawn in to the history of Jesus' arrival as the child of Joseph and Mary. Our work of spiritual preparation brings us to the point of the whole season. What good is it that Christ comes into my heart if I don't then carry that presence out into the world, just as Mary did?

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Dear parishioners,

This past week, I was asked by a couple of individuals about the maintenance work occurring at the school. I thought I would take the opportunity to provide information on that project and a couple other maintenance matters to the community as a whole. Recently we discovered a termite infestation in one of the classroom walls. Happily, after inspection, it was determined to be limited to that particular wall. Some of our school dads volunteered their time to remove and replace the sheetrock and repair the damage, and the building perimeter has been treated to prevent another infestation in the near future. Like so many maintenance costs, it was an unforeseen but necessary expense for the upkeep of our parish property.

On a separate note, the heating system in the church is not functioning properly yet again. Last December we arranged for the system to be repaired, but new problems have since developed and only one side seems to be working at this point. While another repair may be in order to see us through this winter, I would like to address the problem in a more permanent manner, and will discuss the matter with the finance council at our upcoming meeting.

Last but not least, the work in the sacristy is coming along very nicely. So far, two of our parishioners have generously donated many hours to extend the tiling on the floor and to repair the sheetrock on the wall where a large, and very dilapidated, bookshelf previously stood. Thank you to these gentlemen for making this possible! Hopefully, a fresh coat of paint and improved lighting will come next.

Much progress has been made over the past year to address important projects and I am confident that the community can come together to help make the remaining work possible.

Andrew was Saint Peter's brother, and was called with him. "As [Jesus] was walking by the sea of Galilee, he saw two brothers, Simon, who is now called Peter, and his brother Andrew, casting a net into the sea; they were fishermen. He said to them, 'Come after me, and I will make you fishers of men.' At once they left their nets and followed him" (Matthew 4:18-20).

John the Evangelist presents Andrew as a disciple of John the Baptist. When Jesus walked by one day, John said, "Behold, the Lamb of God." Andrew and another disciple followed Jesus. "Jesus turned and saw them following him and said to them, 'What are you looking for?' They said to him, 'Rabbi (which translated means Teacher), where are you staying?' He said to them, 'Come, and you will see.' So they went and saw where he was staying, and they stayed with him that day" (John 1:38-39a).

Little else is said about Andrew in the Gospels. Before the multiplication of the loaves, it was Andrew, who spoke up about the boy who had the barley loaves and fishes. When the Gentiles went to see Jesus, they came to Philip, but Philip then had recourse to Andrew.

Legend has it that Andrew preached the Good News in what is now modern Greece and Turkey and was crucified at Patras on an X-shaped cross.

Reflection

As in the case of all the apostles except Peter and John, the Gospels give us little about the holiness of Andrew. He was an apostle. That is enough. He was called personally by Jesus to proclaim the Good News, to heal with Jesus' power and to share his life and death. Holiness today is no different. It is a gift that includes a call to be concerned about the Kingdom, an outgoing attitude that wants nothing more than to share the riches of Christ with all people.
