Peter J. Hebert, 90, of Bad Axe, passed away Friday, Sept. 19, 2008 at St. Mary's Medical Center in Saginaw.

He was born July 15, 1918 in Chandler Township, son of the late Nelson and Virginia (Ducharme) Hebert. He was raised by Mr. and Mrs. Charles Dondineau on their family farm in Pinnebog. Peter married June Sternberg on Nov. 30, 1941 at Sacred Heart Catholic Church in Bad Axe. After graduating from the Pinnebog High School, he enlisted in the United States Navy. He served in the U.S. Navy from 1942 until 1945 on the U.S.S. West Point Navy Transport as a Medic in the Hospital Corps.

Mr. Hebert was a well known banker in the Huron County area for 41 years. He first worked for Hubbard State Bank in Kinde. He was a former Chairman of the Board for Community Bank which had seven branches in Huron County.

Mr. Hebert was a parishioner of Sacred Heart Catholic Church in Bad Axe. He was also a member of many area boards and clubs: Huron Memorial Hospital Board of Directors, the Knights of Columbus #1546, Bad Axe Rotary, V.F.W. and Verona Hills Golf Course.
